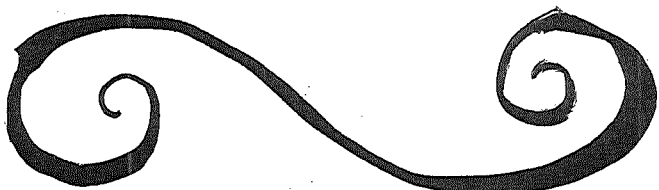

Every gesture is an act of creation.

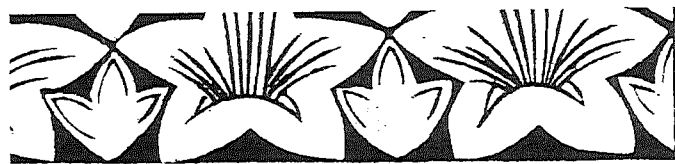

And watch and wonder

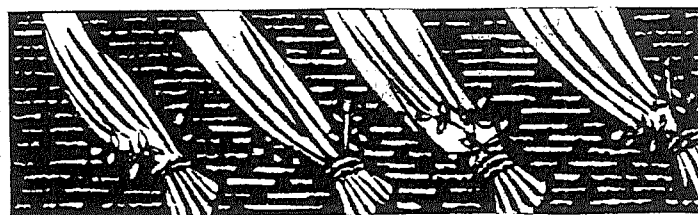

If you'd like to learn more about CA native plants, both in the garden and in the wild . . . come along!

SATURDAY APRIL 30TH 1-4 PM

We'll meet up at the Bolinas School for a tour of the all native, drought-tolerant, low maintenance garden that Ben Lowrance and I installed two years ago. It was meant to be a learning center for the children and the village, and offers a sampling of many plants from many habitats. Driving past, you may have noticed how quickly it took hold and how it thrives.

That's how it is with plants that belong to a place!

Next we'll board the schoolbus, with Ben as our certified driver, and head up to the Bolinas Mesa to visit a site that Sadjia Greenwood and Alan Margolis began restoring nearly 20 years ago. A woodland habitat, on the edge of a swale, you'll sense and feel a beautiful community of plants, many whom have brought *themselves* to the party over the years.

Next we'll head out for a walk in the Arroyo Honda watershed (along the BCPUD service road) to learn more about the plants in the wild.

It will be a wonderful afternoon, spent with others who want to know more about this place, and what it means to be a habitat gardener.

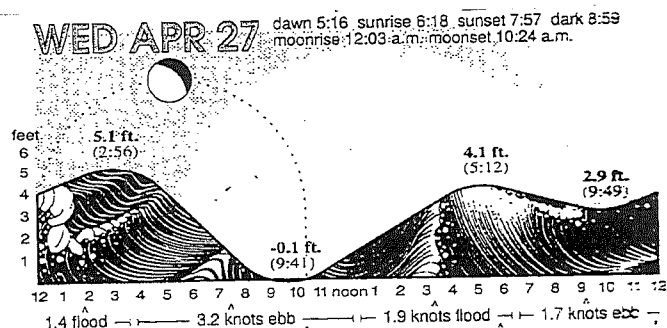
