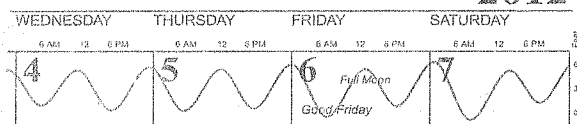

DALE JOHNSON CAME TO BOLINAS WELL OVER A GENERATION AGO

While the Arch-Druids in Washington debate "Health Care Reform" and the constitutionality of "Obamacare", it seems appropriate to consider the example of our own healthcare pioneers here in West Marin. Dale Johnson, long-time healthcare provider in the Bolinas community, embodied community healthcare for over a generation.

Dale's name has "N.P." after it, or Nurse Practitioner, but she has been, and continues to be so much more than this. Dale has been a midwife, a uniquely gifted counselor, a kitchen top surgeon, a massage therapist par excellence, a home for the homeless, a shoulder for the sad and grieving, a volunteer firefighter, a member of the Bolinas fireboard, a community activist, and an exceptional mother and equally exceptional daughter.

You could have walked down any street in Bolinas over the past 30 years and asked a local "where can I find good health care?" and have got the same answer, "Dale". And if you were a little lucky, someone would have pointed her out to you, or given you her home phone (everyone seems to have it) or directed you to her house (most everyone knows where she lives!) Dale is the embodiment of what Health Care truly is for any community. She has been a large part of Bolinas' whole healthcare system for much of her life.

Dale's daughters Heather and Meg remember many nights with meals, and whole evenings, interrupted by, or, eventually, including, many people, local and otherwise, with urgent health issues that just couldn't wait until "the clinic opens in the morning". They also remember their Mom being called away many nights to births as a midwife and as a doula, and to nearly as many home health crises and deaths. Heather: "Beyond the stitches, tests, exams, and prescriptions, many looked to her for emotional support, advice about decisions they were facing, or how to navigate challenges to their health and well being... Her nursing skills were what she could share with a community of people she loved-- and loved to be a part of-- and, to her, it was like a ministry."

I remember being at Staff meetings at Dale's house in Bolinas during which apparently random folk, seemed to wander in, open the Fridge, grab a snack or make a sandwich, and wander back out. Dale's explanation: "Oh, that's Paul. Must be hungry". The eclectic entourage coming and going from the Grove Street household, and in whose homes Dale has borne witness, are Dale's Army, a potpourri of souls who always have come away with the very special gift of her healing presence.

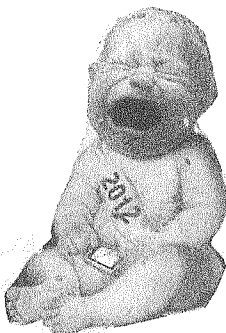
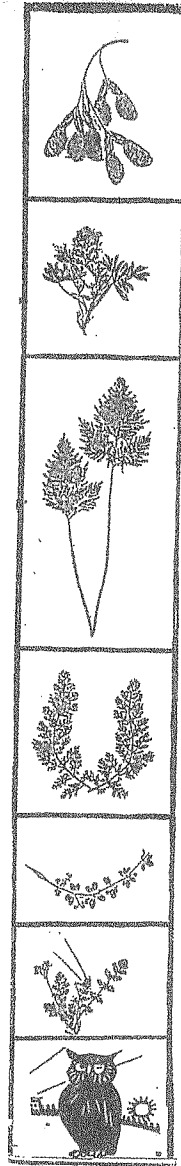
Dale Johnson came to Bolinas well over a generation ago with two young daughters in tow, and a bevy of skills that even she may not have known she had. She quickly became an integral part of the Bolinas community. She did home health care and worked in Commonweal's clinic before joining Patty Bradford to grow the Bolinas Family Practice in 1983. When I started consulting with Dale and Patty in 1987, it became clear quickly that Dale was someone very special. She brought unique skills to what we call "primary care". Dale never took any encounter with a patient for granted. No patient was "just a cold", or "just a sprain." Each person got treated for the whole person they

brought to the visit, and got much more of Dale's attention than just a quick sickness or injury check.

Dale made a brave decision a few years ago when her elderly father was ailing and her mother and family needed her support. Leaving her job in Bolinas, she spent several months bearing witness to and midwifing her father's last days in Massachusetts.

It is no wonder that two years after she moved on to focus on her massage practice, Dale continues to be an icon in our community, and exemplary of what makes up a true caregiver and healer. The Health Care Reformers would do well to take notice of Dale Johnson and like healers who spend their lives in service to a much greater mission than the "right health insurance".

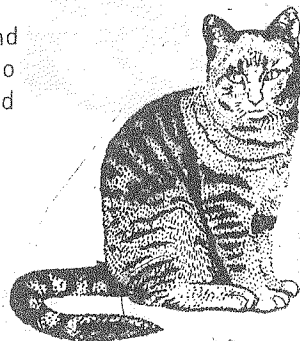

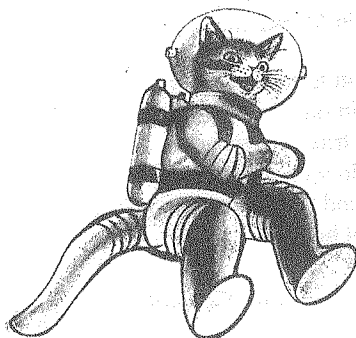

Bolinas man charged in saloon battle as inquiry continues

A Bolinas man convicted in a mob beating in 2008 was back in court Wednesday in a new case that could send him back to prison.

Thoren Manetta, 25, was arraigned on a charge of battery causing serious bodily injury in connection with an incident outside Smiley's Schooner Saloon and Hotel in Bolinas, authorities said. He pleaded not guilty.

"It looks like this is a case of complete self-defense," said his lawyer, Kellin Cooper.

The incident was reported late Friday night, when deputies were called to the saloon and found two men outside with serious injuries, said sheriff's Sgt. Mark Hale. He declined to comment on whether weapons were used.

The men were taken to Marin General Hospital, where they were treated and released. Deputies identified Manetta as a suspect, and arrested him Saturday afternoon in Bolinas.

The district attorney's office charged Manetta only in connection with one alleged victim. The sheriff's department is still investigating whether other suspects were involved.

Anyone with information about the case is encouraged to call the Marin County Sheriff's Office at 499-7233. Witnesses can also place anonymous tips, and possibly be eligible for a cash reward, by calling Bay Area Crime Stoppers at 800-222-TIPS.

Manetta has been on parole since Sept. 30, 2009, after serving time for assault with a deadly weapon. He was one of six suspects convicted in the 2008 beating of Ricky Green, a Bolinas street musician, during a confrontation near the beach.

Green suffered a fractured skull and other injuries after he was kicked, punched, stabbed with a knife, and pummeled with a skateboard, bottles and a flashlight, authorities said.

Director for West Marin Fund

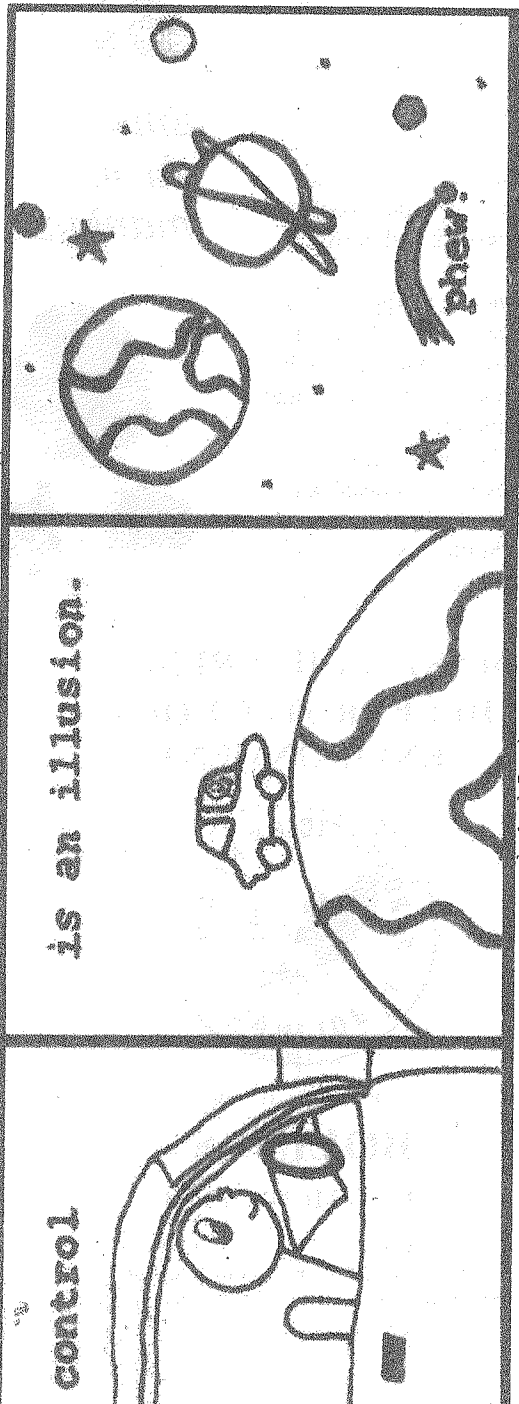
The West Marin Fund announced this week that Catherine Porter, a nonprofit consultant and a former director for Commonweal, has been named the nascent organization's first executive director. Porter is a past executive director of the Consultative Group on Biological Diversity, which manages a network of 50 national foundations working to address global environmental and sustainability issues. As Director of New Initiatives at Commonweal, she helped create a collaborative on environmental health, now a major program for the Bolinas-based institution. "We are thrilled to have found someone of Catherine's experience and caliber to lead [the fund] into our next phase," chairman Dick Lemon said. That phase will include establishing the organization's grants, youth philanthropy and microlending programs over the next year. Porter, who said she fell in love with the region after first setting eyes on it 30 years ago, will begin immediately.

Bolinas to test water well

The Bolinas Community Public Utility District agreed last week to begin monitoring a small irrigation well it tapped years ago as a potential emergency water supply for fires and periods of extreme drought. Rob Gailey, a hydrogeologist who has performed preliminary examinations of the well since it was discovered in 2009 at the Bolinas-Stinson Resource Recovery Project, told the district's directors that it was doubtful the quantity of water produced by the well would be high enough to merit costly efforts to extract and treat it for domestic use. "The water now is extremely hard"—high mineral concentrations—"so it's not going to taste very good," Gailey said. The recovery project currently uses the well to water plants and the district plans to use it to irrigate fields at Mesa Park this summer. Directors said that despite their relative pessimism about the well's production capacity they were obligated to vet it as a potential source for nearby homes. Bolinas, which receives its water from the Arroyo Honda and has two small reservoirs providing back-up supplies, has yet to break free of a 42-year water moratorium. District President Jack Siedman said that even if the well should prove insufficient for domestic purposes, it would be a relief to find a third source of water to allay future emergencies.

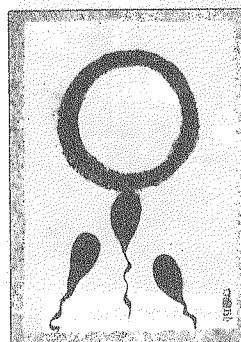
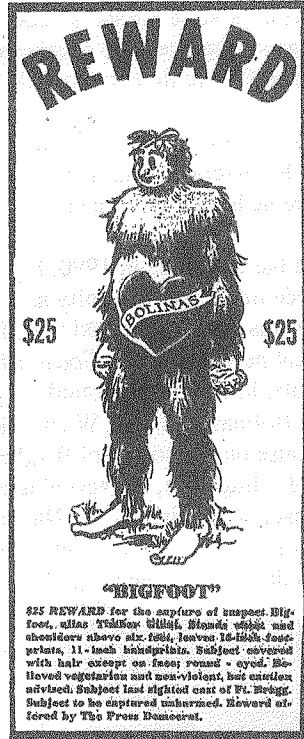

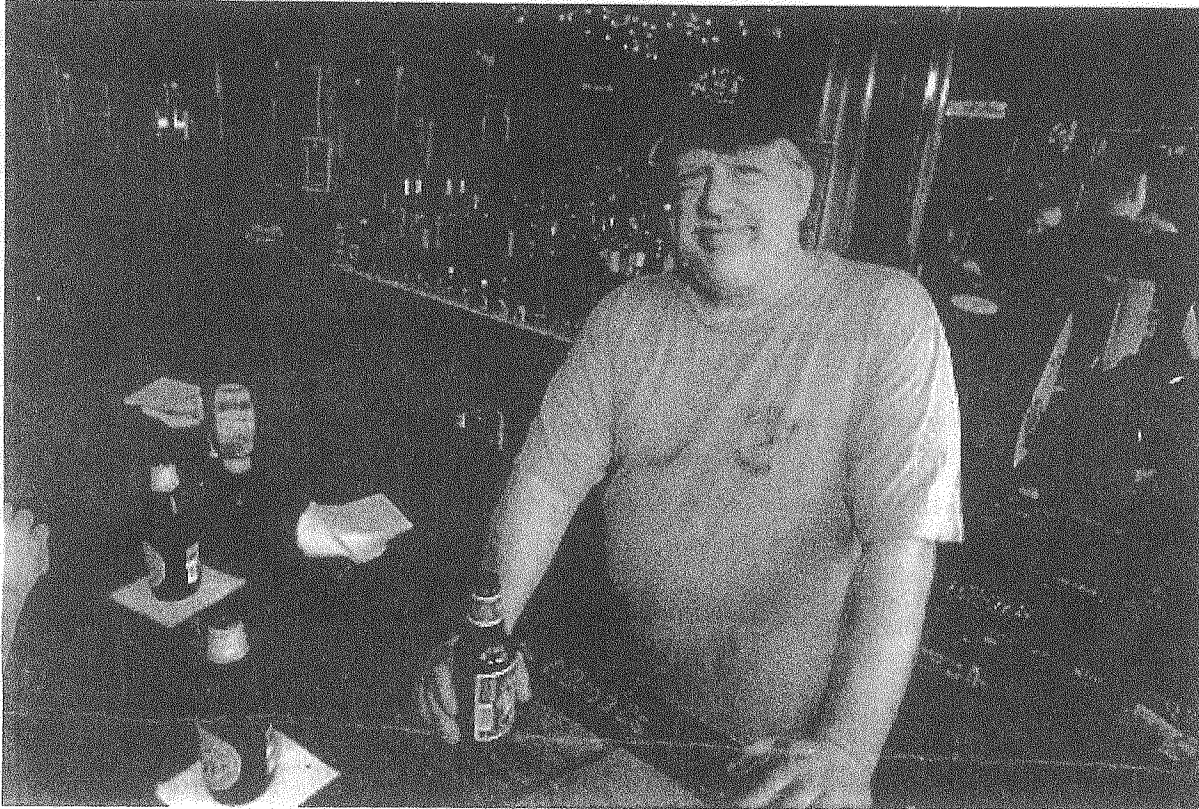

Best Hideout Saloon in a Hideout Town

During Prohibition, Smiley's Schooner Saloon in Bolinas painted all of its windows black, except for one. Through the lone clear pane, townsfolk going about their daily, 1920s-era business saw all the set dressings of a barber shop. What they didn't know—or likely did—was that the other windows concealed a back door out of the law-abiding tontorial parlor and into a free-flowing Elysium of gin.

So goes one of the many tales about the white, Victorian-style coastal saloon, reportedly founded in 1851.

According to local lore and carved into website legend, the one-time speakeasy has also been a hangout of Al Capone, a pizza parlor, post office and bait shop (at different times); a pooch-friendly establishment and the oldest continuously operating bar in California.

The notorious saloon was founded by Isaac Morgan, a captain who arrived in the town that came to be known as Bolinas (but was then Jugville) in 1849. The Gold Rush-era entrepreneur also purchased the property that would come to be known as Stinson Beach in 1852, where he harvested timber, built boats, raised livestock and grew apples.

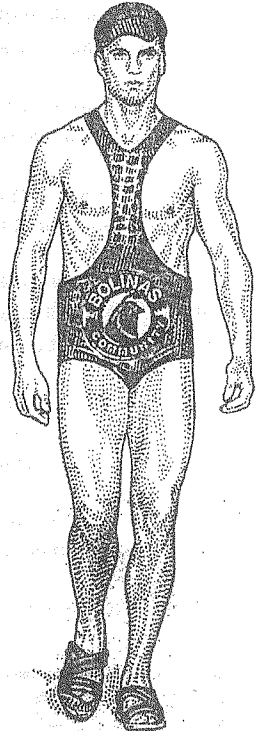
Smiley's current owner, Don Deane, purchased the bar and hotel in 1990. In a town that was mostly a hippie enclave through the '60s and '70s, Deane describes his entrée into the community as a "little bit of an exception." At the time, he was a supervising probation officer and says he was initially greeted with suspicion and mistrust. Yet through his posts in local organizations, his publishing of a local newspaper, the *Coastal Post*, his position as a foster parent and his eventual acquiring of the landmark watering hole, he's certainly found his place in the community.

Deane describes the bar as a "continuous thread in Bolinas' history." When asked for legends, Deane affirms Al Capone's visit to the town, saying he stayed in a house on the corner of Brighton and Altura streets. He doesn't know why the nefarious gangster showed up for a slice of village life, but speculates he may have been laying low.

Smiley's offers live music every week in its tiny space. Musician Henry Nagle, no stranger to Smiley's worn-wood room, describes it as a "post-apocalyptic, Old West movie set. If the Eagles weren't so materialistic and vain, 'Hotel California' might well have been written about this diamond in the rough."



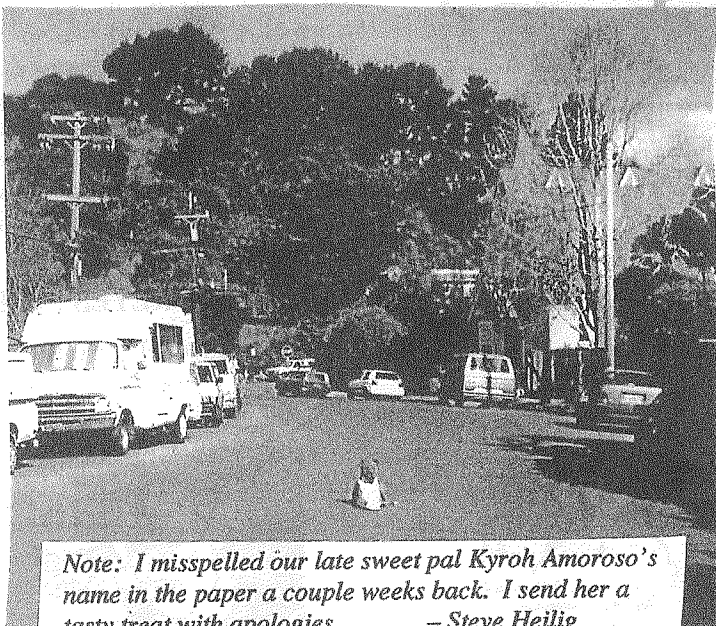

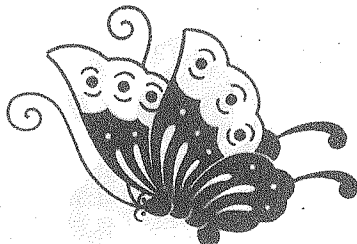

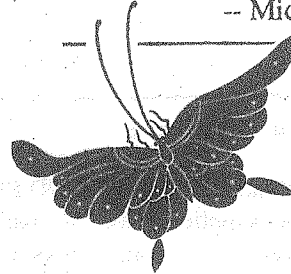
