strains of his iron office.

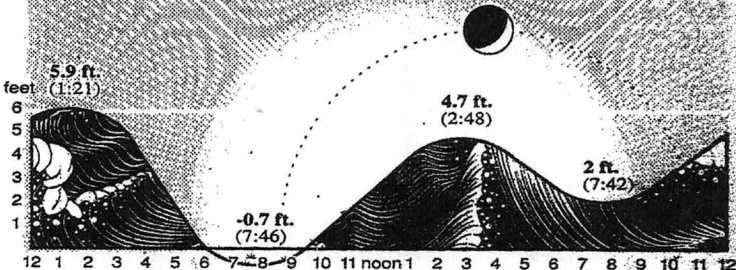
