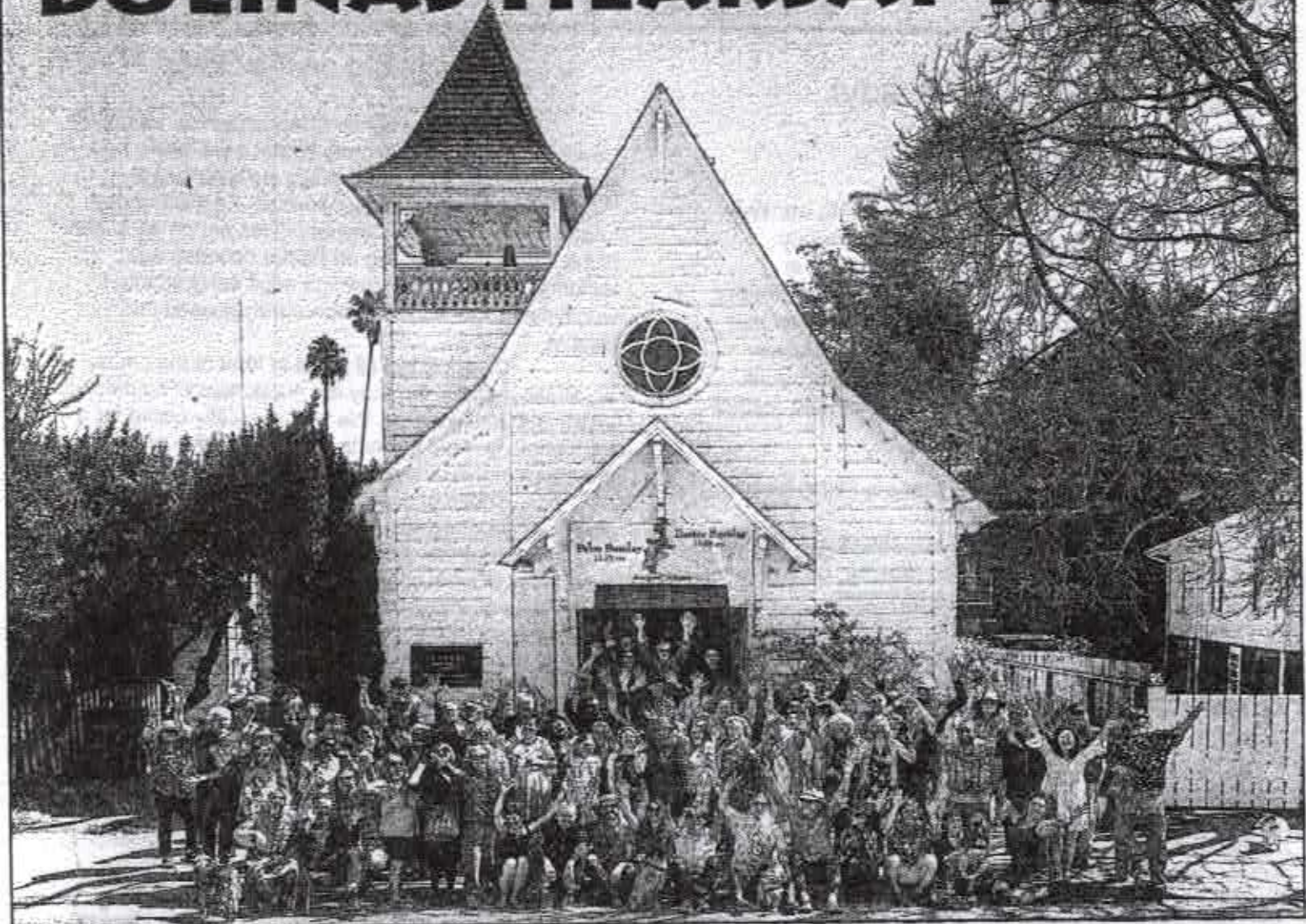

Certainly not all those in front of the church are Presbyterians, but they are supporters of community efforts that make sense. We kind of quietly called for a town photo to help promote our construction effort and the next thing ya' know, the town showed up.

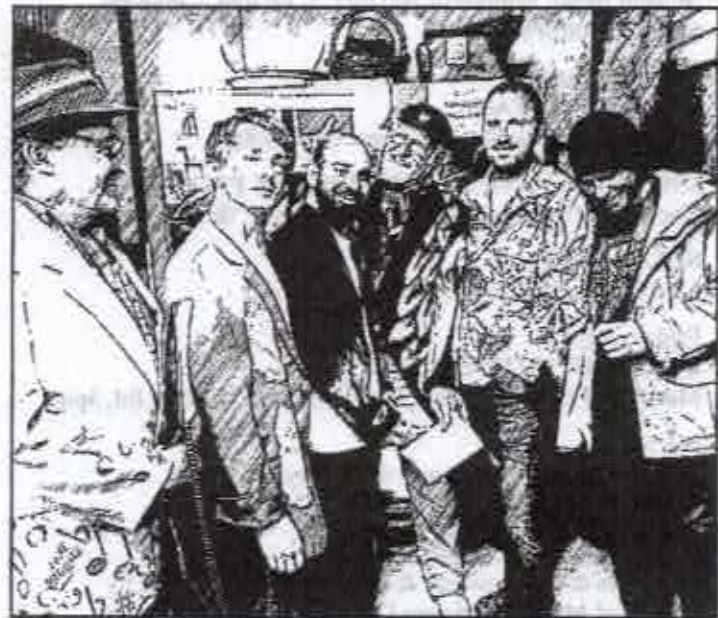
Those of us close to the church see it as a landmark structure with desirable intrinsic value that should be used more than it is. There are many logical extensions of what church is all about for which it is suited. The building and its old-growth redwood, hand-hewn timbers, old wooden pews, and arching trusses could be an additional resource for the community and appeal to everyone in an ecumenical way. It's ideal for music performance with its natural acoustics. There's a stage that's seen more than a few Christmas pageants and choir recitals. It is an easy place to listen to someone speak; it makes a great classroom and in fact there's higher education every Sunday morning.

The structure is a building of recognition; visitors remember seeing it and then realize they've found Bolinas before.

Our mission is to bring the building into the 21<sup>st</sup> century without losing its character from the 19<sup>th</sup>. Besides the foundation, we envision a new kitchen, an ADA-compliant full bathroom, and a balcony we can access.

We'll do it with donations, grants, volunteer labor and many, many hands.

**FIRE CADET PROGRAM**

The Bolinas Fire Protection District is accepting applications for the new Fire Cadet Program. The purpose of the Fire Cadet Program is to provide young men and women an inside look of the fire and emergency medicine profession, to help them make the decision of whether they want to pursue a career in this field. This program will help cadets gain experience as they observe and train with firefighters and assist the Department. Each cadet will learn mental and physical wellness, a sense of self-responsibility, personal growth, leadership, teamwork, and fire prevention skills. Anyone between the ages of 16 and 18 years old who lives in the Fire District and can meet the minimum qualifications may apply to participate in the Fire Cadet Program. The Volunteer Firefighters train on Thursday nights from 7 to 9 pm. and on some Saturdays. The Cadets are expected to attend and train on these days with the regular Volunteers unless it interferes with schooling. An additional schedule of training can be set up for the Cadets so both schooling and department training priorities can be met. The trouble is, by the time you hear them, it's hard to get out and talk to them. A lot of older people who are bothered just can't move that fast.

I've seen some kids practicing dirt bike techniques, jumping, etc.

Several of the kids have been really nice, yet four of them have refused to give me their names. What's this all about?

One kid lives in Stinson and rides in Bolinas. Are we going to get other out-of-town kids coming here because they think it's OK to ride on the mesa?

I hope you kids and you parents will heed requests of people who are bothered. Even if it's not illegal, this is a residential neighborhood, not a dirtbike track, and recreational motorcycle riding is a disturbance to people who cherish the peace and quiet of a small town. Thank you.

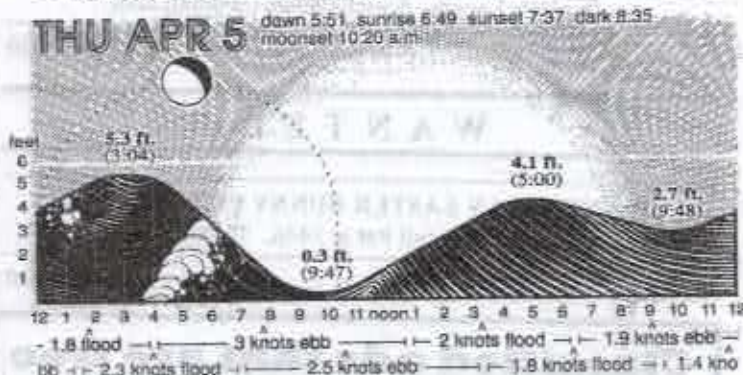
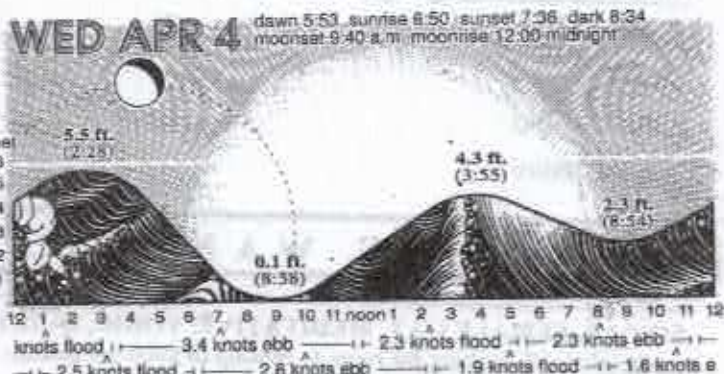
