The Bolinas Commons: "What are they building in there?"

Well, the simple answer is "community." A few months ago, when Uniquities went out of business, the seven collective members that run the Book Exchange next door got together to discuss the idea of extending some of the values and community spirit of the bookstore into this much loved site. From there, a new collective of 25 members was formed to envision and develop this new space, which we named the Bolinas Commons. Many of us share the idea that there are many types of community activities that would fit more appropriately in a small, intimate space, like the Commons. From this, a simple mission statement emerged: "A gathering space for celebrating, learning, and sharing creativity to build a stronger community." In our first few months, we have hosted lectures, art classes, a dream class, Bo-CAN meetings, housing meetings, film screenings, book readings, two open-house events with pop-up, local craft and food sales, a seed swap, art exhibits, pot-lucks, and many collective meetings where we continue to try to envision a sustainable, inclusive, and intimate commonspace for the Bolinas community. Faultline Institute: "Still a good idea!"

Faultline Institute was founded in 1973 by a bunch of renegade intellectuals who thought that adult education, taught locally, was a good idea. It was originally part of the Adult Education Program of the Tamalpais High School District, serving West Marin. One of the original descriptions reads as follows: "The classes are taught by residents from the towns of Bolinas and Stinson Beach, making the idea of a community teaching itself a reality. Faultline, over the years, has surfaced and resurfaced and now has surfaced again. It keeps coming back because it IS still a good idea and has benefited many people in many ways, over the years.

Faultline Institute @ the Bolinas Commons: A place for classes, workshops, learning groups, and lectures

For most of its existence Faultline Institute has been an itinerant classroom, holding classes in people's homes and other varied locations. Last month at the Commons, we put up an inspiring exhibit of old catalogs and ephemera from Faultline's 40-plus year history and asked wether housing a new Faultline Institute in the centrally located and newly energized Bolinas Commons might create new educational opportunities and access for the Bolinas community. Faultline co-founder, Retired Dean Emeritus, Michael Rafferty, bestowed his blessing upon the new space, and Harriet Kossman, co-founder and Dean), met and brainstormed with members of the Commons collective. From this meeting emerged Faultline Institute @ the Bolinas Commons. Together, we plan to create opportunities for classes, workshops, learning groups, and lectures at the Commons. The first summer term will run from June 20- August 9. If you are interested in teaching or hosting a class, workshop, learning group, or lecture please contact us by May 30th.
