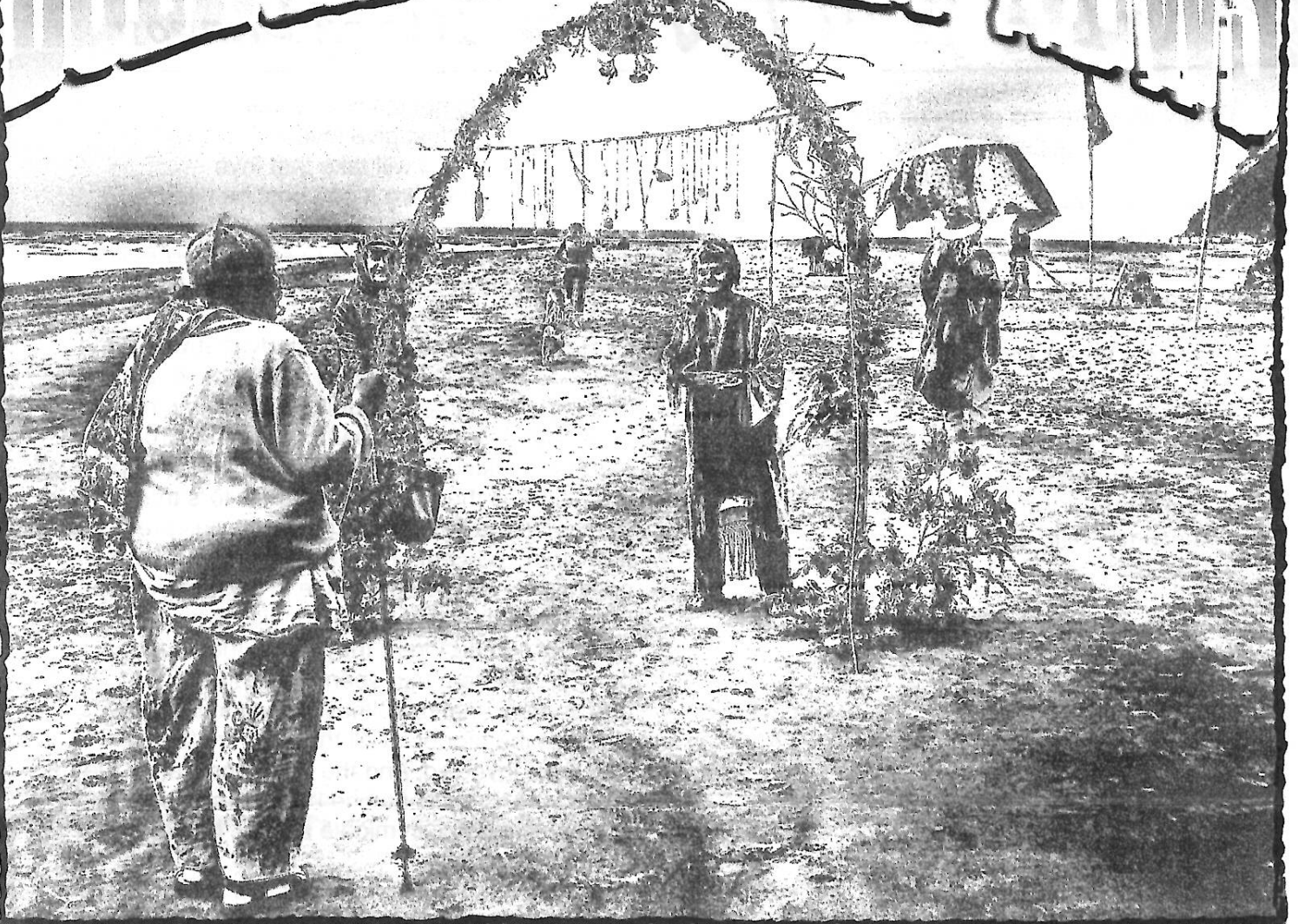

The Power of Love in Molding One's Character

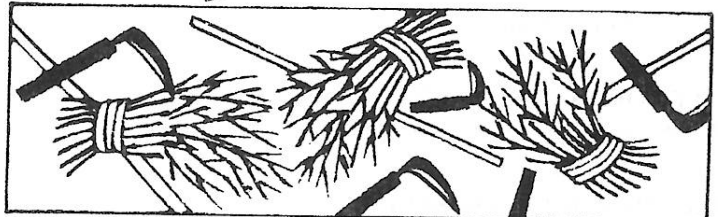
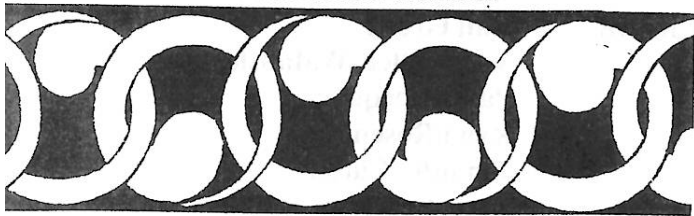
I read some time ago of a study that was done at Johns Hopkins University in Maryland, a study of a certain segment of delinquent young men. They found that in this particular set of circumstances, looking at background, childhood upbringing- -all the different social factors that determine these kinds of things-- it was predicted that ninety percent of this group of two hundred boys would spend some time in jail. But years later, when they went back to this particular group of two hundred, they found that in fact only four of them had spent time in jail. So of course they analyzed: they looked at the statistics, at the model, at all the different factors that were involved. And the one consistency they found was that all of those boys, at some point in their schooling, in middle school, had had one particular teacher.

So they went to her, trying to find some way of explaining this statistical anomaly. They showed her the list, and as she was reading the names, she was murmuring in recognition of each one. Her eyes became misty, almost filled with tears, and she said: "You know, I loved those boys. I loved those boys."

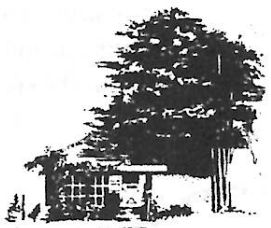
That love, I am sure, is what empowered those young men to break out of the statistical prediction-- to beat the odds, morally speaking.

Zim sculpted the original in wax. It's about 2 and a half feet tall. Jerry Gnome was cast at Art Works Foundry in Berkeley and used 27 pounds of bronze.

The Gnome symbolizes the playful spirit of Jerry Garcia - warm and welcoming - a genuine source of inspiration. Rubbing the belly is said to bring good luck and great guitar solos.

Zim plans to take Jerry on the road. His whereabouts will be posted on the website.

Bronze casting is expensive but Zim is also going to cast Jerry Gnome in colored concrete, your choice of Touch of Gray, Dark Star or Tie Dye.

Tommy, Louise, Rose & Peadear come from families steeped in traditional Irish music.

Tommy (*fiddle*), was born in London to Irish parents, who had emigrated from the west of Ireland in the early 1950s. His father Tommy Sr. was a well known piper & concertina player from Co. Clare. Tommy grew up listening to traditional music & playing with all of the legendary Irish players who were living in London, including: Máirtín Byrnes, Raymond Roland, Roger Sherlock, Danny Meehan, Paddy Taylor & Bobby Casey. He also recalls meeting John Kelly & Willie Clancy during frequent visits to Ireland. With his father & Sisters, he performed throughout Ireland and the U.K. - including The Royal Albert Hall, London.

Louise (*Banjo & Accordion*) from Galway, played with her father Denny & local fiddlers: Joe Morris & Jim O'Brien, flute player Joe Collins & friend Paddy Hession. In her late teens she broadened her musical horizons & became part of Galway's vibrant session scene. It was there that her banjo playing was influenced by Charlie Piggott.

The best one yet. Just the right number of people to be public but also intimate. And the slight overcast was perfect for keeping the babies cool.

True Heitz was at the smudge gate, through which one entered sacred space. A large circle marked in stones enclosed a central altar with one of Tom D'Onofrio's sculpted dolphins.

At the beginning of the Baby Blessing, Magi spoke about Tom D'Onofrio and Pierot Resta, both of whom were major contributors to the Sun Festival. Both Tom and Pierot passed last year.

The somber mood continued when Mark Butler summoned the memory of Mary Heal's baby, who died in infancy. Waylon was his name and Waylon was the first baby that we welcomed to Bolinas.

The Baby Blessing ceremony was simple and sweet. Mark called out the name of the baby and then the parents carried the baby around the circle so everyone could smile and cheer and make goo-goo eyes. Then after circumnavigating the circle the baby was blessed with water at the center altar, with the help of Michaela and Rain.

Later at the park I spoke with Colby and Ciarra, Tom D'Onofrio's daughters, who helped with the blessing for 18 years. They loved that the Baby Blessing was still happening.

Mark asked me to make up a welcome song to sing. As usual I had nothing prepared and hoped that the moment would provide.

Annie Owen offered to help me sing the babies' welcome. Excellent! I thought, the school music teacher is going to help me. And Annie had the same kind of guitar as me - a Taylor Baby, the smallest guitar Taylor makes. There were two Taylor Babies at the Baby Blessing.

Beforehand I had listened carefully to the tone of the beach and decided that the key of A would work nicely. I also knew that the Welcome song was going to be a simple two chord wonder.

We learned it on the fly. Annie quickly picked up the guitar riff. And she sang the simple song right along with me in perfect pitch.

"Waylon, Waylon," we sang "Welcome to Bolinas." The crowd sang right along with us, and added their own color to the welcome song.

Annie and I would sing to each other and then turn and sing to the crowd as we followed the parents and the baby around the circle.

It was so great having another singer with the same guitar. And that guitar slinger was a woman. It was Annie but I knew She was a Deva, a Daikini, sent by the Goddess to assist in the most fabulous Sun Festival ever.

We blessed 15 babies, sang each and every one around the circle. Melinda didn't have to shout "Sing It" Instead she yelled "You got it going on."

We did. We did have it going on. But it took all of us gathered there at the end of Wharf Road on the sacred beach. It took all of us to make such a beautiful celebration of life and renewal.

I'm grateful for the spirit of Sun Festival and for the beautiful community of Bolinas..

After the beach it was time for the feast in the park. Melinda and her crew had the cob oven fired up and soon there was delicious pizza.

Then the Maypole, which was set up at the center of the labyrinth. Each one chose a ribbon to hold and then while Magi played waltzes and polkas on the accordion, the People wove a new fabric of life and CommUnity.

At the end, when all the ribbons were wound tight around the Maypole, and all the people were snug 'round the center, then arose the holy Group Om as at every Sun Festival since 1976.

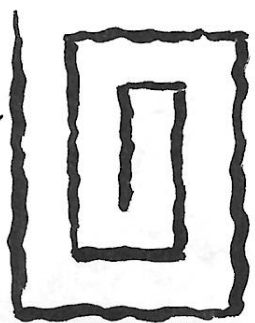
“Lives of Rocks”

We - all painters and writers – don’t want to be political. We want to be pure, and artistic. But we all know, too, I think, that we’re not up to the task. What story, what painting, does one offer up to refute Bosnia, Somalia, the Holocaust, Chechnya, China, Afghanistan, or Washington, D.C.? What story or painting does one offer up to counterbalance the ever-increasing sum of our destructions? How does one keep up with the pace? Not even the best among us is up to the task, though each tries; like weak and mortal wood under stress, we splinter, and try to act, create, heal. Some of us fall out and write letters to Congress, not novels; others of us write songs, but they are frayed by stress and the imbalance of the fight. Some of us raise children, others raise gardens. Some of us hide deep in the woods and learn the names of the vanishing things, in silent, stubborn protest.

Paint me a picture or tell me a story as beautiful as other things in the world today are terrible. If such stories and paintings are out there, I’m not seeing them.

I do not fault our artist for failing to keep up with or hold in check, the world’s terrors. These terrors are only a phase, like a fire sweeping across the land. Rampant beauty will return. In the meantime, activists blink on and off like fireflies made drowsy over pesticide-sodden meadows. Activism is becoming the shell, the husk, where art once was. You may see one of them chained to a gate, protesting yet another Senate-spawned clear-out, and think the activist is against something, but the activist is for something, as artists used to be. . The activist is for a real and physical thing as the artist was once for the metaphorical; the activist, or brittle husk-of-artist, is for life, for sensations, for senses deeply touched; not in the imagination, but in reality.

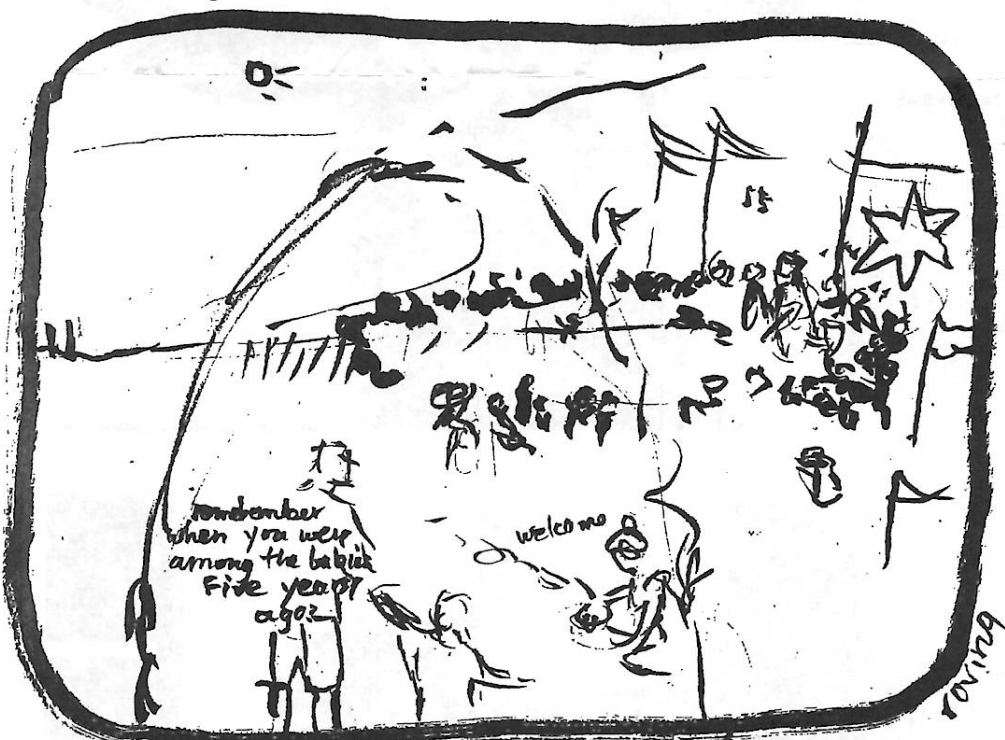

In the June 7 primary election, Inverness and Bolinas led all Marin County precincts in voter turnout (precincts with 30 or more registered voters). Inverness finished #1 with 60% of its 566 registered voters turning out and Bolinas came in #2, with 54% voting of the 952 registered voters in Bolinas.

Bernie Sanders dominated the presidential voting in Bolinas, with 301 votes to 166 for Hillary Clinton. In Inverness, it was a tighter race, with 161 for Bernie compared to 141 for Hillary. In both precincts, Donald Trump garnered most of the Republican votes, pulling 13 votes in Bolinas and 12 in Inverness.

The election results are available online on the Marin County website if you want more details. Bolinas' precinct number is 412179.

BABY BLESSING PHOTOS ARE PRINTED

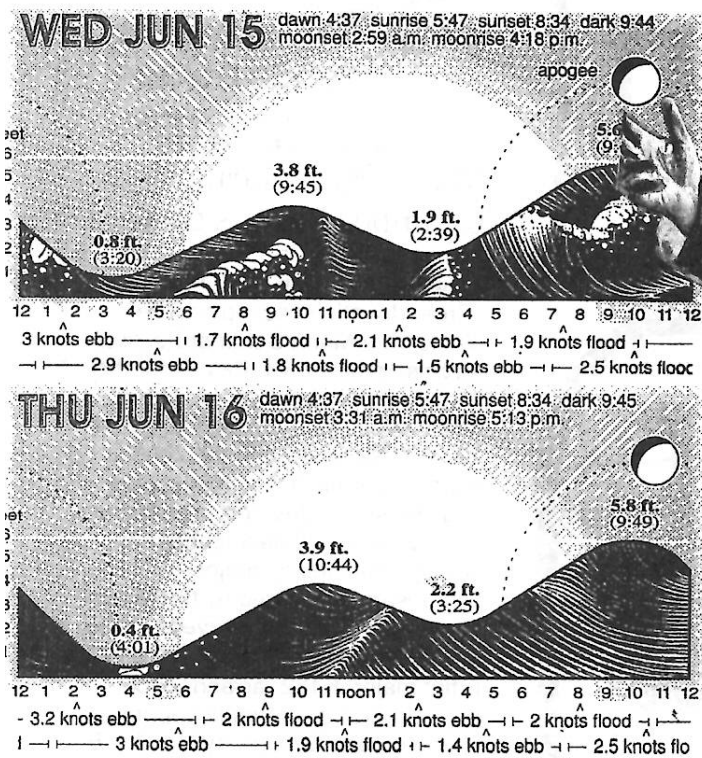
