El Velador

On Sunday night Roadside Cinema presented the documentary "El Velador" (the Night Watchman) by Natalia Almada at the Farmstand. The film focuses on the night watchman of the Humaya cemetery, in Culiacàn in the state of Sinaloa, Mexico. Culiacàn is at the center of the Mexican drug trade and the cemetery is where many of the dead drug traffickers, narcos, are buried in palatial mausoleums.

The film makes only oblique references to the *narcos* and the drug cartels by including snippets of television and radio news reports. There is no sensationalism, no dead bodies, no assault rifles. Instead the pacing of the film is like the cemetery itself - somber and reflective. The dead *narcos* are referenced only in memorial plaques and pictures. None were over 30 years old.

I found the most impressive thing about the film to be the filmmaker herself - Natalia Almada. Although Natalia is originally from Culiacàn she spoke with no accent and was amazingly articulate during the question and answer session after the screening.

Natalia spoke about the challenges of making the film. How difficult and dangerous it was for a lone woman to document the macho world of the drug trade.

She said that she was accompanied by a bodyguard from her father's ranch. Whenever he told her it was time to pack up and leave she did so immediately even if she was in the middle of an important shot.

Natalia remarked that the best light for filming was at dawn and dusk and *El Velador* is often quite beautiful. She also included plenty of nighttime shots as befits the story of a night watchman.

Natalia often used close-ups. For example she focused on the hands and feet of the construction workers building the mausoleums. Their coarse hands and worn out shoes made a powerful statement about the poverty of the workers compared to the wealth of the *narcos*.

El Velador is a fascinating film about the war on drugs. It makes its point in a subtle and lyrical way, and paints a picture of Mexico that rarely gets shown. ¡Bravo, Natalia!
