TRIO GARUFA: TANGO SHOW AND WORKSHOP

Trio Garufa is an international ensemble dedicated to performing authentic Argentine music. 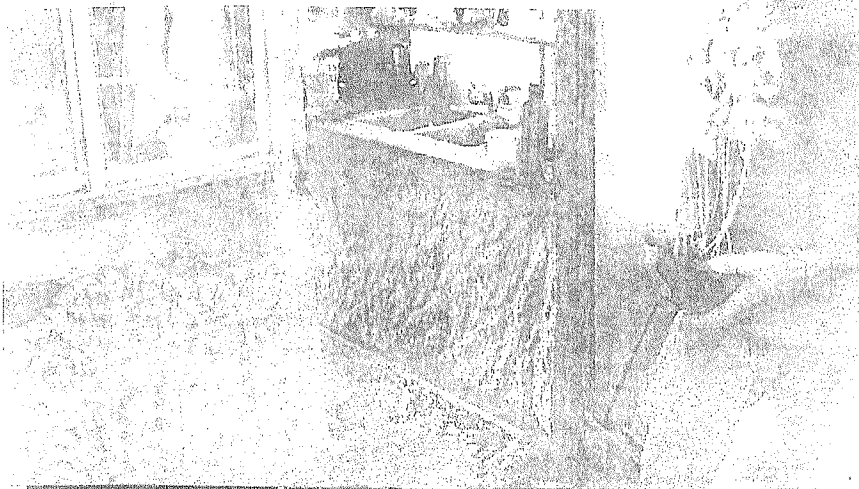

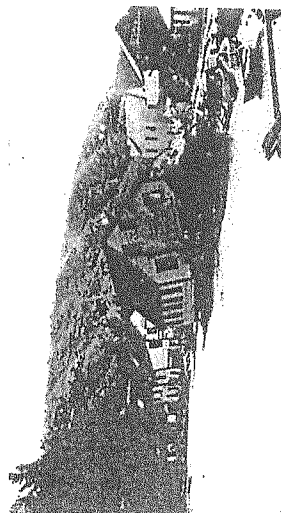

Marin History Watch: A social hub in Bolinas

On June 18, 1903, the Marin Journal quoted a San Francisco columnist's snide remark about the Flagstaff Inn "at a dusty little place up the coast called Bolinas which seems to be congenial only to San Rafael society people." Built in 1862 and first called the Gifford House, the hotel overlooked the Bolinas lagoon "where the steamers are daily coming and going." Boating, fishing and bathing were popular attractions, and at one time rooms could be had for \$2 a day. A wing added later for public meetings and dancing helped make the hotel a social hub "full to overflowing most of the time." Sadly the 1906 earthquake toppled the Flagstaff into the lagoon (pictured), after which it was salvaged for lumber.

The citizens of Bolinas had done it again. To be fair, I had been warned. A friend told me that the people who lived in the tiny unincorporated community were notorious for cutting down the highway sign that points "outsiders" towards their hamlet. Yet for some foolish reason I had looked for it anyway. After a quick backtrack south, I hit my target, and walked over to the beach to meet Ian Maclaird, a friend of a friend — my inside man.

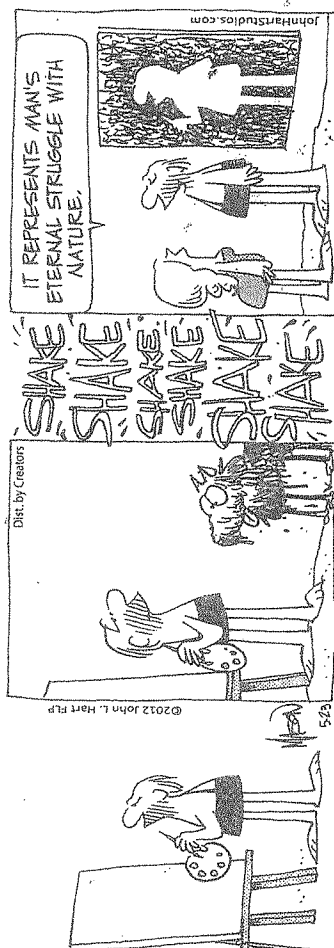
At least someone still uses signs in Bolinas! When I told him about my goof, he laughed. "The county finally stopped replacing the signs," he said. "It was costing them a fortune." It was the first sunny, deliciously warm day I'd experienced along the coast so far, and the surfers were out in full force. I salivated looking at the peeling waves, but I pulled myself away. I had come to Bolinas for a reason: to learn about magic plants (and, no, not the hallucinogenic variety). Ian and I drove to BoTierra Biodiversity Research Gardens, and met up with John Glavis, the botanist who founded the gardens (and one of Ian's old colleagues). "Did you know that quinoa leaves are 20 percent protein?" John asked me upon arrival. "Everyone eats the seed and ignores the best part of the plant!" he added as he held one up for emphasis. Ian offered me a handful of purple seeds to try. "Now those, those are from Styrian pumpkins," John said as I chewed. "They have no pesky seed coat to remove and are often pressed for oil high in Omega-3s." Nutty, meaty almost. Lots of flavor.

"Our motto is 'plants from the past, food for the future,'" John said, as we continued our tour. All of the plants (there are about 60) that John grows at BoTierra come from places with climates similar to the Bay area's and were traditionally grown by the indigenous peoples there, but have been largely forgotten. "Ah, now this one, this is Ashitaba from Japan. Researchers at Tufts University have had exciting results with its sticky yellow sap curing liver cancer," John said as Ian handed me an Inca berry in a golden husk. I enjoyed the burst of sweet and sour from the tomato-looking fruit inside, as I listened to John talk about each plant with the boastfulness of a proud dad.

Taraweeh is being used to feed children in the Andes. Plus, it smells like honey. The greenhouse was the last stop on our tour. John's face lit up as he pointed out a pretty purple and yellow flower that smelled like honey. "Now this little guy is the Taraweeh, or Andean Lupine. His seeds are made of 40 percent protein, and they're being fed to mal-nutritioned school children in the Andean highlands, where the plant originates," he said beaming at the flower. "For me, growing flowers to feed children is about as good as it gets." I couldn't argue with that, so I thanked both Ian and John for sharing their secret garden with me. Bolinas man pleads guilty to assault charges for saloon fight

A man charged with assault after a Bolinas bar fight pleaded guilty Monday, although his lawyer maintains he was defending himself.

Thoren Manetta, 25, faces up to six years in prison when he is sentenced Aug. 1, said Deputy District Attorney Otis Bruce.

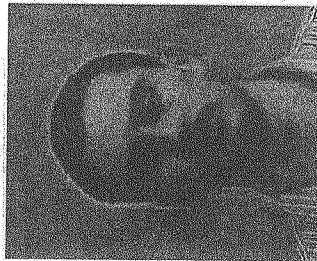
The incident occurred March 23 at Smiley's Schooner Saloon and Hotel, where deputies were called to a fight and found two men with serious injuries outside the bar. Deputies identified Manetta as a suspect and arrested him the next day.

Manetta was initially charged with injuring one victim, but ultimately pleaded to assault against both. Prosecutors dismissed a charge that would have counted as a strike toward a life sentence under the state's "three strikes" law.

"We've always thought this case was a case of self-defense," said Manetta's defense attorney, Kellin Cooper. "What Thor and his family have decided to do is put this behind them and move on. He is a young man with a lot of potential."

Manetta, a former Mill Valley resident, was one of six suspects convicted in the 2008 beating of Ricky Green, a Bolinas street musician, during a confrontation near the beach. Green suffered a fractured skull and other injuries after he was kicked, punched, stabbed with a knife, and pummeled with a skateboard, bottles and a flashlight, authorities said.

Manetta was sent to prison for assault with a deadly weapon. He was paroled in 2000.

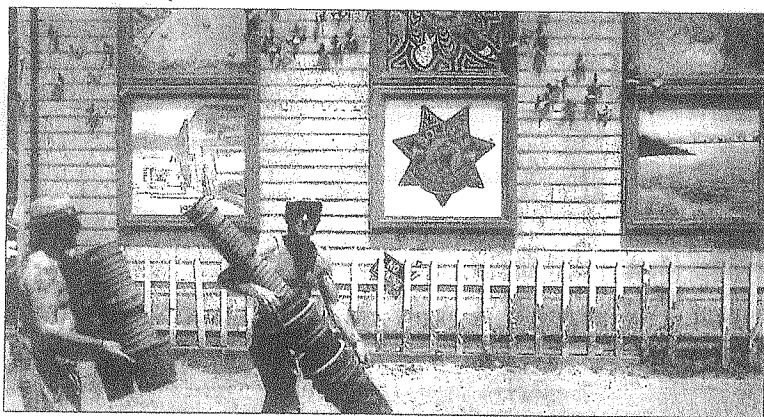


Thoren Manetta was sentenced to prison in 2008 for the assault of Ricky Green in Bolinas. (Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation)

SUNDAY DRIVE: MARIN COUNTY'S AGATE BEACH

The beach: Marin County's Agate Beach is a gorgeous destination tucked on the western side of Bolinas. Cliffs provide towering views of the coast. Short walks lead down to the waterfront, best visited when low tides provide access to tide pools, limited sandy beach frontage and 2 miles of waterfront. Some visitors have difficulty finding Agate Beach, with the street signs in Bolinas often stolen.

Highlights: A pretty cove meets a shoreline point, which enters the sea and extends into Duxbury Reef. During low tides, the adjacent area is a vast tide-pool reserve, one of Marin's best. The tide zone and nearby Bolinas Lagoon provide a rich marine food source that often attracts a variety of seabirds.

View: From the cliffs above the beach, clear days yield sweeping views of the tide-pool reserve below and beyond to the Farallon Islands.

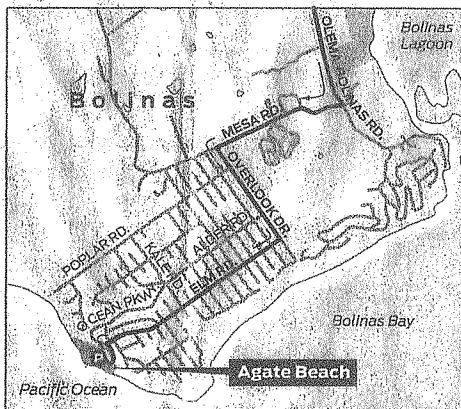
On-the-spot note: Visit at low tide. High tides cover most of the tide pools and beach area. Low tides unveil them.

Minus tides: Minus low tides will roll back the ocean early Sunday morning and bottom out at 8:30. Most of the morning will be good.

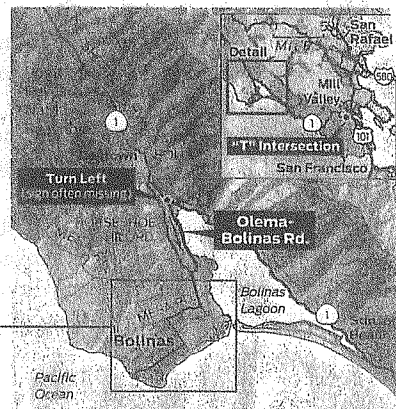
Where is the agate? Good question. I believe the name refers to the cobbled beach, not the actual mineral.

The drive: Pick a clear day, and as you emerge from the west flank of Mount Tamalpais, you get a series of ocean lookouts. You will pass Rocky Point, Stinson Beach and Bolinas Lagoon en route to the turn at Bolinas.

Dogs: Permitted on leash. No, yer eyes ain't foolin' ya. You actually can bring your dogs on the beach. They are not permitted on the tide-pool reef.

Cost: \$2 per vehicle parking fee for Agate Beach.
Facilities: Restroom, benches.
Hours: Agate Beach open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
Note: Signs for roads, streets and turns have a magical way of disappearing in Bolinas. Carry this story and map on your trip to stay oriented; newcomers are advised to print out a photo of Bolinas from Google Earth/Maps that includes street names.
Contacts: Marin County Parks, (415) 499-6387, marincountyparks.org.

How to get there: From San Francisco, take Highway 101 north over the Golden Gate Bridge and continue 4 miles to Marin and the exit for Highway 1/Stinson Beach. Take that exit and continue west for 1 mile to the stoplight at the T intersection for Shoreline Highway/Highway 1. Turn left on Shoreline Highway and drive 16 miles (stay on Highway 1 at all junctions) just past Bolinas Lagoon to Olema-Bolinas Road. Turn left and drive 1.8 miles (at 1.3 miles, bear left to stay on Olema-Bolinas Road) to Mesa Road. Turn right and go 0.6 of a mile to Overlook Drive. Turn left and go 0.5 of a mile to Elm Road (the third right). Turn right and go 0.9 of a mile to Ocean Parkway. Turn left and go a short distance to a parking lot on the right.

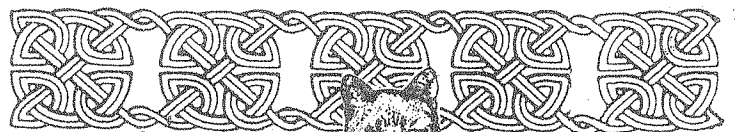

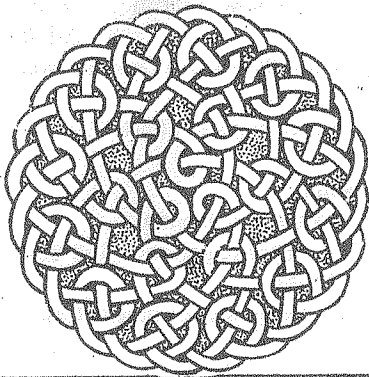
