There was one kid dressed as a plant who stood stock still. Another kid crouched hidden under a table to stick his hand through a box on top. (Surely you remember "The Thing" from the show.)

Giovanni made a great Gomez, unflappable and spaced out.

By the way Giovanni sings with the band *El Radio Fantastique* from Pt. Reyes. They played at Commoweal's Open House and we all had a great time dancing. They'll be playing this Friday at Smiley's.

Back to the play - I got a big kick out of the ghosts, who were played by some of our town's leading citizens. They obviously had such a good time dressing up and cavorting on stage that their joy was infectious.

Lucien made a great Lurch, standing tall in thick platform shoes. He also played keyboards with his dad on bass, Tony on sax, Danny on guitar and a snappy drummer.

The kids were beautifully choreographed by Bridget, who also managed the house.

Howard Dillon deftly handled the demanding task of truant officer. The scene at the school office with Mollie and her big hair was priceless.

It was a wonderful show. Molly Maguire is a genius. Congratulations.

After the show I thought about the counter cultural values espoused by the Addams Family.

What would happen if the Addams Family moved to Bolinas?

"Wait a minute!" I thought "That's what happened when the Jefferson Airplane bought the house at the end of Brighton."

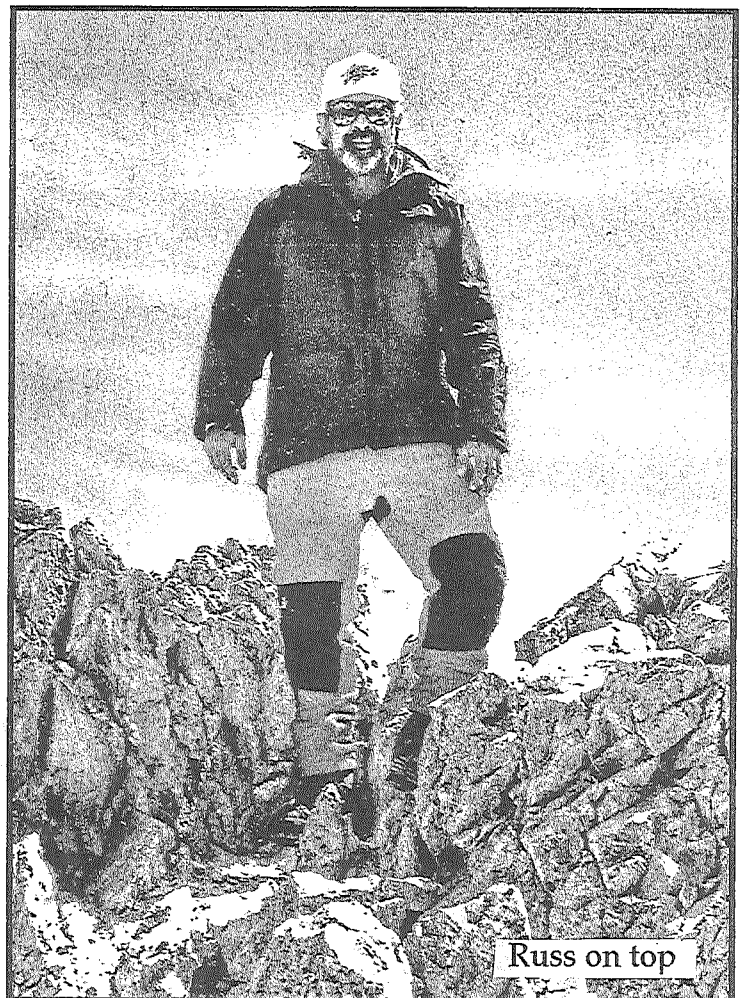
