Gillyflower

I was speaking with Eatdog in the Freebox about recycling clothing.

"You gotta see what I'm doing with Freebox pants and shirts." he said. "I'm making wind socks and kites out of them."

"The birds were eating my strawberries." Eatdog explained. "and I don't like netting. So I put up a couple of cheap plastic kites to scare away the birds. The wind ripped the kites to shreds in a couple of days.'

"But I knew it was a good idea, so I made my own kites with Freebox clothes. I use bamboo and fishing line, and put a fishing swivel on the line to let it spin in the wind. Come up to the nursery and check it out."

A few days later I dropped by Gillyflower Nursery on Overlook. Sure enough there were golden pants and purple shirts fluttering all over the place. "It looks like a party's going on." Eatdog said.

Indeed, the brightly colored clothing had a distinctively human appearance when inflated by the wind. The shirts and pants had new life and were twisting the night away at Gillyflower.

Eat dog gave me a tour of the nursery and explained his unique art form. He works with succulents and brightly colored tumbled glass beads, arranging them into fantasy habitats. He populates the surreal environments with toy dinosaurs (another innovative use of stuff recycled from the Freebox.)

It's a beautiful art form. The low growing plants and the glittering glass remind me of peyote. Oftentimes on peyote, the ground would shimmer with radiant colors as if it was covered with colored glass crystals.

Eatdog showed me his art studio. It was a compact covered space. Numerous containers and jars held crushed and tumbled glass in a rainbow of colors. I noticed a bucket or two of plastic dinosaurs.

"This is where I come to compose my pieces." Eatdog told me. "I often tie in the color scheme with the color of the succulent's flower."

The creative possibilities were dazzling. and I loved the way Eatdog crafted his art using nature and recycled materials.

"Give me a plug." he asked me. "I want people to visit the nursery and see this stuff."

OK, Eatdog, here's your plug: Gillyflower Nursery is usually open Saturday and Sunday 11-5. It's on Overlook near Mesa Road.

Check out Rick Springer's stone carvings while you're at Gillyflower. I especially like one piece with a big snake draped on it. The fluidity and heft of the snake's body is beautifully articulated in stone.

In February 2012, a group of conservationists and animal experts at the world's biggest science conference pushed for large marine mammats to be given the same rights as humans. Experts at the American Association for the Advancement of Science conference in Canada said they wanted support for a Declaration of Rights for Cetaceans (dolphins, whales and porpoises).

Psychologist Dr Lori Marino

said: "We went from seeing the dolphin-whale brain as being a giant amorphous blob that doesn't carry a lot of intelligence and complexity, to not only being an enormous brain, but an enormous brain with an enormous amount of complexity that rivals our own." It could also be argued that cetaceans could be far more intelligent than humans.

Meanwhile, researchers at Speak-Dolphin.com have reported significant breakthroughs in deciphering dolphin language. Using CymaScope technology, dolphins' complex system of whistles, moans and clicks can now be converted to images, which researchers can document alongside dolphin's behavior in order to interpret their meaning.
