i love this town. it is as quirky as it is beautiful, with the serenity of a sleepy coastal hamlet and the soul of a tortured artist. stray dogs roam the streets, multimillionaires reside side-by-side artists living in squalor, and the afternoon light is something from a tangerine dream.





Post Office established 1863

Bolinas is one of Marin's oldest towns, with a rollicking past. In 1850 Bolinas was the biggest and busiest place in the county. Of the 323 inhabitants counted that year in the first U. S. census of Marin, two-thirds were in Bolinas Township. They were mostly men busy cutting down the big trees, milling the logs and shipping the lumber to San Franciscomuch of it on schooners built right here.

Before the arrival of the loggers and their noisy saws, Bolinas was the quiet Mexican Rancho las Baulenes (a name probably of Indian origin.) Two former soldiers, Rafael Garcia in 1836 and Gregorio Briones ten years later, raised cattle for hides and tallow and enjoyed the leisurely life of the day. More cattle were brought in after lumbering ended, dairy cattle this time, and dairy ranching flourished—but today there are no more dairy ranches at Bolinas.

Stagecoaches began clattering in regularly during the 1870's to connect Bolinas and its sheltered beach with the towns on the other side of the mountain. Starting in the early 1880's, summer homes could be built in a subdivision laid out near the beach by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Waterhouse. Today the original houses are still there together with newer homes.

Expansion to the mesas or plateaus above the town proper began in 1909 with a subdivision on what is called the little mesa, above Brighton Avenue and Wharf Road. The biggest subdivision was in 1927 on the big mesa: more than 5,400 lots on 300 acres. The 20 x 100-foot lots sold for \$69.50 apiece to persons who subscribed to the San Francisco Bulletin.






MORE on the Bolinas Store Mural Project
