SOLAR INSTALLATION REPORT

f rom Jenniepfeiffer

The latest report from Steve Kinsey's office is that Liza Cross sent me the following email on Friday regarding permitting and third party inspections. I would encourage checking out the special offers solar companies have going this month. I have been in touch with Marie Gunter at Sungevity, 510-496-5689, which is a "green" company that works with non-profits and offers promotions that give donations to organizations such as the Sierra Club, Wildlife Federation, etc. They have done many installations and make it very easy and affordable, with purchase or lease options. I asked about the possibility of a promotion that would benefit our school foundation. She was very open to that idea. Solar City is another company. They also have specials. From our research, Solar City is more corporate. Seems they are planning to go public soon with stock options.

Here's what Liza wrote:

Thanks for your note. I was able to confirm that third party inspections are available for building permits for solar/PV installations. It is easy to request the third party inspection, one just completes a form and submits at the same time as submitting the permit application. However, the third party inspector will expect to be paid. Many contractors like this extra service because it is faster than the usual county inspection and are willing to pay the third party inspector. It is important to remember that the Fire Marshall must also make an inspection of PV installations for fire code compliance, and there is no third party inspection available for the Fire Marshall.

Also of interest to community members is there is now a "express permit" process available on Wednesday mornings in room 308. People can walk in and present their proposed project to a building official and a representative of the Fire Department. Assuming all necessary information is presented and the project meets requirements, they can get a permit the same day. But inspections will be required as normal. I know that some people are fearful of any county official coming on their property, but I did speak with both Bill Kelley, the Chief Building Official, and Scott Alber, the County Fire Marshall, about the concern about other unpermitted work being reported and both provided assurances. Both Mr. Kelley and Mr. Alber stated that when they conduct inspections that they focus their inspection on the scope of the permit, and do not look at other structures, septic, etc. The only exception is if they see something imminently hazardous, e.g., bare electrical wires.

I hope that answers your questions...feel free to let me know if you need any other information. Also feel free to share this email with others. If you would like to speak with Bill Kelley directly you can reach him at 473-6550. I know he would be glad to speak with you.

Anita (our fire chief) does our local inspections. I will keep the community informed by way of the Hearsay, what our experience is as we move forward on our installation project. JP



Downtown Park Update

At the last several meetings of the park committee, the primary issue of discussion has been whether the park should be used by vendors selling food, art, dry goods, whatever. The park committee has decided to recommend that sales be limited to Saturday flea markets. John Glavis and StuArt have volunteered to coordinate those flea markets, designating set up areas and assigning spaces. Otherwise, the park is not to be used for commercial activities. The Mesa Park Board's next meeting is on Monday, September 10, 2012, at which time the committee's recommendation will be presented to the Board for approval.

In the meantime, there will be a ribbon cutting at the park entrance at noon on Labor Day to formally dedicate the park. However, there has been no selection of a name for the park because there is no consensus among the committee, or in the community at large on selecting a name from among the 50+ suggestions. Therefore, the committee will recommend that the people of the town start referring to the park themselves, and see what name is most commonly used.

Also left for resolution is what to put in the circle at the front of the park, which was designed as a children's play area. Some people want a boat, some an abstract climbing structure, and others think it should remain a circle with nothing in it. The committee needs more community input on this one.


Heard It at the Hardware




