Thank you to everyone who responded to the recap of the BPUD discussion on the new playground in last week's Hearsay.

The response has been overwhelmingly positive to a new children's play area downtown. Over 120 Bolinas residents signed a petition for a downtown children's playground last weekend. I've heard from many mothers who want a space for their children to play while meeting other parents downtown. There is universal agreement that any play area should incorporate natural materials, enhance the local ecology, and be in keeping with Bolinas.

It is important to acknowledge though that some people don't believe we should have a new play area for children downtown in any location. Cheryl and Damiano Ruggiero wrote in Monday's Hearsay, "Bolinas already has a plethora of play areas for children..." They also wrote that they were "dismayed at the disrespectful and presumptuous statements" that I wrote in the recap. My apologies to Cheryl and Damiano and anyone else who may have taken offense at my summary of the BPUD meeting. There also was one anonymous note posted on the General Store bulletin board that opposed any new playground and accused parents of "pimping children in pursuit of an agenda." "Go fly a kite," the note suggested helpfully.

This is community dialogue in action, and I'm thankful to everyone who has participated. I'd like to specifically recognize the community-building leadership of Mark Butler and Meg Simonds. Mark and Meg both firmly expressed their opposition to building a playground on the county land behind the tennis courts. They quickly followed that by personally advocating for a children's play area in burnt park next to the General Store.

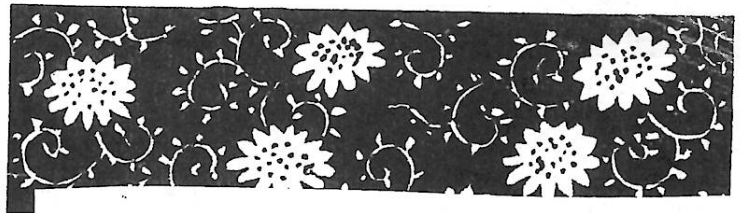
Clearly a new play area downtown won't solve the demographic crisis that Bolinas faces. We need affordable housing to help long-time residents remain and attract people in their 20s and 30s to raise their families here. If the number of children in Bolinas continues to fall we will soon hit a point of no return.

As the old Greek saying goes, communities become great when people plant trees under whose shade they'll never sit. Thanks to everyone for their commitment to making Bolinas great far after we all pass.

We still have so much to share but wanted you to know that this grand experiment of teaching, learning, and communing together seems to still resonate as "a darn good idea".

We are starting to organize the fall semester. The dates will be September 19th-November 18th. Instructions will be published soon on how to sign up to be a teacher, student, or facilitator. We are hoping to have an interesting array of classes, workshops, and group meetings offered. People have requested more music classes, lecture series, life drawing and beginning Spanish. Any interested teachers out there?

So, thanks to everyone who made this good experiment such a success. Let's keep it going!

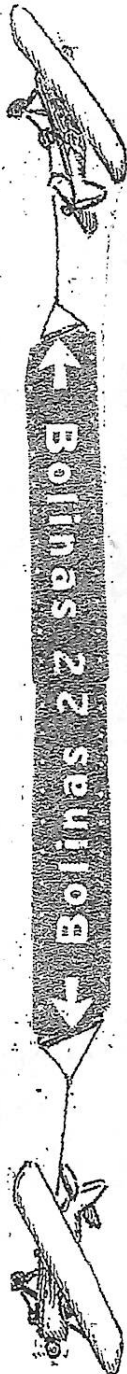

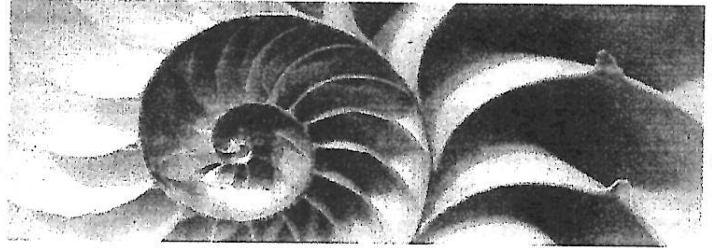

The Biology of Wonder: Aliveness, Feeling, and the Metamorphosis of Science

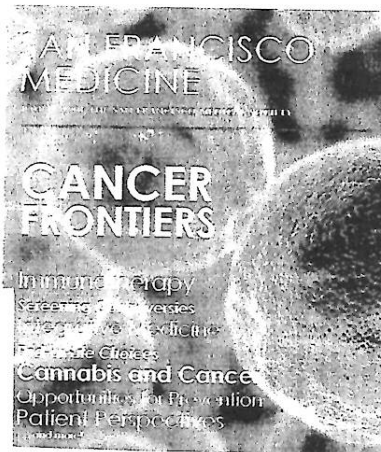

Join TNS Host Steve Heilig in conversation with Andreas Weber, a Berlin-based book and magazine writer and independent scholar. Andreas' work has focused on a re-evaluation of our understanding of the living, and the disconnection between humans and nature, arguably the root cause of most of the environmental catastrophes unravelling around us.

In his recent book, *The Biology of Wonder*, Andreas proposes a new approach to the biological sciences, a "poetic ecology" which intimately connects our species to everything that surrounds us, showing that subjectivity and imagination are the prerequisites of biological existence.

Dr. Andreas Weber has degrees in Marine Biology and Cultural Studies, and collaborated with theoretical biologist Francisco Varela in Paris. His work has appeared German magazines and journals such as GEO, National Geographic, Die Zeit and Greenpeace Magazine. Weber teaches at Leuphana University and at the University of Fine Arts, Berlin. He has published more than a dozen books, most recently the English editions of *Enlivenment: Towards a Fundamental Shift in the Concepts of Nature, Culture and Politics* (Heinrich Böll Foundation 2013), and *Biology of Wonder: Aliveness, Feeling and the Metamorphosis of Science* (New Society Publishers 2015).

Andreas is part of the staff of und.Institute for Art, Culture and Sustainability, Berlin, which is devoted to link the fields of art and culture with the field of sustainability, and to develop exemplary models of productive exchange. Andreas was named as the 2016 Jonathan Rowe Commons Fellow at the Mesa Refuge, a writing residency center in Point Reyes, CA
