

The draft Conceptual Design Report for the Bolinas Lagoon North End Project will be discussed at a Bolinas Lagoon Advisory Council (BLAC) Special Meeting on September 29, 2017. The meeting will be held from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., at Audubon Canyon Ranch, Volunteer Canyon, 4800 Highway 1, Stinson Beach.

The public is invited to attend. At this meeting the BLAC will be asked to provide a recommendation about the project to the Marin County Board of Supervisors. The project's objectives are to alleviate chronic flooding of Marin County and State roadways and improve traffic safety, improve the function of Lewis and Wilkins Greek, enhance riparian and wetland habitats, and allow for future expansion of Bolinas Lagoon as sea level rises.

Bolinas escapes heat wave for Labor

Clouds and a major cooldown in temperatures showed up for the annual Bolinas Labor Day Street Party and Barbecue to benefit the town's community center.

Given the oppressive heat the region experienced over the weekend, Monday's weather was far from a bad thing for the

"I'm so happy, because if it was burning hot everyone would be at the beach," said Lia Sabbatini, general manager of the community center, as light breeze moved tablecloths at an eating area dotted with food booths. "This is what I wanted. Whoo boot"

Later in the day, the National Weather Service even reported a few sprinkles around Marin from the remnants of a Baja storm. Temperatures will continue to drop Tuesday before settling into the 70s and 80s for the rest of the week, said Steve Anderson, a meteorologist with the weather service.

"That high pressure system is moving out and being replaced by ocean breezes," he said, "We won't see any more of that extreme heat anytime soon."

The Bolinas street party is a tradition more than 40 years old. A silent auction, two stages of live music and an abundance of food were among the festivities.

"It's our biggest event for the community center," said June

McAdams, who was working at the dessert booth. "We have a lot of locals coming by, but we get people from the outside too."

McAdams and two associates presided over colorfully sprinkled cupcakes, apple pies, chocolate chip cookies and other goodies as people walked around the grounds, checking out the sweets with wide eyes. "Everything is donated," Mc-

"Everything is donated," Mc-Adams said, proudly. "It's all baked here in town."

More than 1,000 plates of food were expected to be sold by the end of the day, including tamales, barbecued food and blueberry cobbler.

The silent auction featured surfboards, art, kayaks, vintage glass and ceramics among other items, all on display in the community center.

"This helps us. It's a nonprofit community center," said Sabbatini, adding she hoped the event would raise \$20,000 and that the work of 100 volunteers was indispensable. "We need the funds to keep classes and activities that we offer at a reasonable price."

Reggae shows, theater productions, after school programs, yoga sessions, food banks, meetings and a monthly breakfast for those in need are some of the events held at the busy hub.

"This pretty nice," Bolinas resident Meg Simonds said of the weather. "We close the street, there is music all day. It's quite a community event and I'm glad the clouds are here. You can dance and not swelter."

County to improve Agate Beach Trail as part of inclusive access plan

Marin County Parks began a \$99,000 restoration project on the Agate Beach Trail in Bolinas last week, part of an initiative to improve access to the county's trail system. Beginning last week, the trailhead leading to Agate Beach is closed to the public from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on weekdays only. Construction, which is likely to last around a month, will include drainage improvements, resurfacing to level the pathway and the installation of box steps on a portion of trail close to the beach. According to the parks department's senior open space planner, Craig Richardson, "the trail shouldn't look that different once the work has been completed, and the project will address a maintenance issue at the trailhead that was especially difficult last winter." Six other trails will be improved, including at White House Pool and the Roy's Redwoods Meadow Trail in West Marin. The projects are part of the county's inclusive access plan, which was adopted in August 2016 by the Marin County Open Space District's board of directors. The plan included an evaluation of the existing inventory of pedestrian trails and recommendations for ways to increase the equitability of access-including the potential use of service animals, mobility devices and visitor amenities. The plan is funded by Measure A, which since

2013 has funded \$11.5 million in park and open space infrastructure repairs, vegetation management, conservation and public programs. But at least for Bolinas resident William McGovern, the Agate Beach project is "unnecessary." In a letter published in the Hearsay News last week, Mr. McGovern expressed concern that the county would "likely advertise the newly refurbished trail, possibly with clear directions, thereby adding to the traffic on Elm [Street] and the presence of people at the beach and the trail." A new sign will indeed be erected, Mr. Richardson said, posting information about the trail's new width and gradient.




