Miwok Music Workshop this Sat. Sept. 17, 2-5 pm at Kule Loklo

Join us for the Miwok Song & Instrument Workshop this Saturday 2-5 pm at Kule Loklo in Point Reyes National Seashore, led by Miwok storyteller Sky Road Webb. Participants will learn to sing songs in Miwok language and will choose a simple percussion instrument to make - either a Shatum (clapper stick) or a Lawik (bullroarer). Instruction and all materials will be provided.

Sky Road Webb is a Tomales Bay Miwok descendant who leads Coast Miwok songs and prayers at celebrations throughout Northern California, and he was featured in the 2014 Mount Tamalapais documentary The Invisible Peak.

Location: Kule Loklo Miwok Village is a short walk from Bear Valley Visitor's Center in Point Reyes National Seashore, 1 Bear Valley Road in Point Reyes Station.





PACIFIC COAST

Along Calif. 1, Stinson Beach boasts a 3-mile stretch of white beach that's safe for swimming; the village makes a good stop for sandwiches. Just north at Bolinas Lagoon you may see egrets and waterfowl, or spy harbor seals hauled out on Pickleweed Island. Bird-watchers might observe any of 115 species at Audubon Canyon Ranch, a 1,000-acre preserve on the lagoon where great blue herons and egrets nest in spring at the tops of redwood trees At the north end of Bolinas Lagoon try to find the road to Bolinas; for decades, residents have sought anonymity by taking down the signs marking the turnoff to their town. It's a tranquil hideout with an organic-hippie-artisticcountercultural spirit, although it is now becoming upscale.



from Bark: A Polemic, by David Meltzer, Capra Press, 1972):

In Bolinas town-dogs hang around like dandies, hang-out like candystore cut-ups, lost for action, always under foot.

In their eyes the signal: What's happening? Que pasa? Vas machstu? Where's the action? In Bolinas town-dogs are bored & thoroughly collectivized. They are free dogs, liberated from masters, they eat from house to house. Low to the ground to imitate a small dog they eat out of the smaller dog's backyard bowl until small dog's master hits big dog in the rib-cage with a chip of broken glass nobody will sew up.

Last week a young woman hit a young man's dog & the young man said he would cure the dog with Black Magic & cursed the woman with Black Magic & told her not to touch his animal because all women are polluted & he didnt want his animal to be polluted. The dog remained an attentive audience. He was uninjured.






