This is the second in a series of letters from Mary's daughter Bethany, while Mary was in the hospital.

Perfumed Wind from Greece

Dear Mom and Mag,

Well, we have not stopped for a minute and we are truly exhausted in a good way.

We are now in Athens and slowly making our way home. Layover of ten hours!!! Poor Olympic Air had to cut flights, thus we had to leave a little earlier than planned. Winfield is sleeping by my side with his head phones on listening to music. The wind, the Meltemi, has kicked up and we are watching as jasmine blossoms fly by the windows of the hotel. Not to mention napkins, cats, human beings, palm fronds etc...

We sat up with the landlord last night despite an early call this morning. He brought out his homemade Raki (fire water) and then his homemade wine. My head was spinning when we got back to the studio. I tried to pack, but was far more interested by my little feline friends who were crying at the door. I fed them milk and promised them that I would be back.

We sailed to Turkey which was wonderful despite the wind. The wind was cooling and kind of exciting in the very exotic port town of Bodrum. The sea was a milky turquoise blue shot with lapis. The antiquities lie on the ground everywhere. Pillars, capitals, statues... The castle sits above the port and the Turks drink a lot of coffee and sell a lot of Turkish Delight. They have pulled so many amphoraé and other ancient things from the sea that the mind is completely boggled not to mention envious.

Yesterday, we sailed to Kalymnos which is the famous sponge island. For centuries, the Greeks have dove for the sponges in the deepest sea. Now, they are piled in a range of sizes in big wicker baskets. I bought island herbs and sponges from an old woman whose face bristled with whiskers. She kept using Italian words, so I finally spoke to her in Italian because my Italian is better than my Greek. It turns out she was a young girl during WWII when the Italians landed on the island. She learned Italian from them. That was quite a pleasant surprise...to speak Italian to a Greek woman in the middle of the Aegean on a tiny island. We then ate at a restaurant right on the port lined with fishing boats and fishing nets and of course fishing cats. We ate spicy village sausage, cheese seasoned with herbs and olive oil from the island, stuffed grape leaves, tzatziki, house anchovies in lemon juice and olive oil, homemade white wine... Then the owner of the restaurant took us out in his little boat to a pristine beach where the water was clear for meters and meters. It was dreamy.

I have bought you wild thyme honey and some sponges. I will put together a package to mail on Monday.

and what isn't. You who know



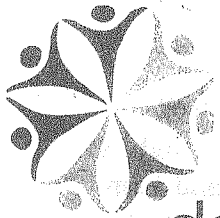

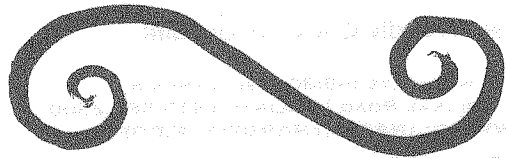

Minutes from the August 27, 2012 Bolinas Fire Protection District Board Meeting

Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:35PM. Vice Pres. Kilkenny, Dir. Smith, Dir. Kimball and Dir. O'Donnell were present. Also present: Chief Brown, Secretary Brown and Jenny Pfeiffer. MSC, O'Donnell/Smith (unan) to approve the agenda.

CHIEF'S REPORT

MERA

None.

Prevention

Chief Brown reported that she is currently working with Todd Lando to finish and mail brochures regarding Wildfire safety. Included in the information will be a Defensible Space Self Inspection checklist. The brochures will be mailed to every property owner and box holder in Bolinas. She reported that there are currently multiple fires burning in California and many Marin County resources are out of the area. She also noted that the vegetation fuel load is continues to increase each year. She stated that the current potential fire hazard is moderate in our area but we are moving into what has historically been our hottest months. She wants to emphasize the public the importance of defensible space and being as prepared.

Jenny Pfeiffer reported that two inspections take place for solar installations, one from the County Building Dept and the other from the Fire Dept. Third party inspections for the Building Dept are available if the property owner/contractor or willing to pay for the service. The fire department does not offer a third party inspection option. Using a third party Building Inspector is generally much quicker than waiting for the County to complete one. The County is offering express permitting for solar installations and limited residential improvements. On Wednesday mornings, they will accept cash and issue permits on the spot if the plans are standard.

Training

Chief Brown reported that wildland and medical trainings continue on Tuesday night drills.

Volunteers

BFD/BCPUD Shared Personnel Update: The reciprocal training issue is yet to be resolved.

Apparatus

Chief Brown reported that E285 will be going to Diego for an annual safety inspection and a safety recall issue from Spartan concerning the Electronic Stability Control. Chief Brown has noticed the problem in the steering function while driving through thirteen curves north on Highway One.

Disaster Council

Chief Brown reported that all DC Area Coordinator radios are with Richard Dillman to be reprogrammed. The West Marin Disaster Counsel meeting took place on August 23rd. Topics discussed included planning for the West Marin Communications drill, CERT dates, Tsunami signage and the Great California Shake Out on October 18th. Chief Brown wants to plan an event in Bolinas on the same date to raise awareness regarding the importance of preparedness. Local evacuation points were discussed in addition to locations for Tsunami signage.

General Operations

Chief Brown announced that the CA Legislature has suspended state reimbursement of agencies cost for complying with the Ralph M. Brown Act. Enforcement of the law is now in question. Several agencies, including the County of Marin, have passed resolutions stating their intention of continuing to follow the Brown Act whether or not it is required. She recommended that the District pass a similar one. She offered to draft one for approval at the next September meeting.

Chief Brown taught a CPR class to the BSUSD staff on August 20th and to the Bear Valley Park staff on August 23rd. She will return to the Park in September to teach another class.

The Marin County Chiefs' meeting was held at the station on August 16th. Sixteen Fire Chiefs attended and BBQ lunch was served by Suki Ferrari. Chief Brown thanked the volunteers who worked hard to prepare for the meeting.

Surfer's Overlook

Dir. Kimball reported that the County signed the second MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) between the BCPUD and the County of Marin regarding phase two of a Geotechnical Assessment of Terrace Avenue at Surfer's Overlook in Bolinas. The proposal was approved from Sanders & Associates Geotechnical engineers ("SAGE"). The purpose of this phase of work is to determine the subterranean ecological conditions below Terrace Ave at Surfer's Overlook and also at beach level. SAGE plans to drill three borings, one at road level and two at beach level and then prepare a report on soil conditions. This information is needed to complete a design for a full-bluff stabilization project. The work is scheduled for Sept 24th and 25th.

Costs and funding for the actual repair are yet to be determined.

Meanwhile, GM Blackman has been working with Bob Beaumont and Tom Lai at the County to secure permits for the work. Dir. Kimball commended GM Blackman for building cooperative relationships with County representatives.

Pres. Buchanan commented that even if the repair is postponed, the preliminary research currently being done will not become obsolete and is not wasted time, money nor energy.

There were a total of five calls on July 4th.

Maintenance Agreement – CHA

Nancy Dombrowski of the Coastal Health Alliance informed Chief Brown that their Board agreed to sign the lease with mention of one item for consideration regarding a cap on their annual maintenance cost of \$5,000 paid to the District. The annual fee pays for maintaining the mutual parking lot, gardens, generator, etc. The Board suggested that Chief Brown update annual generator costs and draft an agreement that caps the maintenance fund at approximately \$25,000. Dir. Kimball will review the written agreement which will be on the next September meeting agenda for approval.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Action Item #1: Approve Final Budget for FY12/13.

With two minor adjustments to the budget, Chief Brown recommended the final budget for approval.

MSC, Kimball/Kilkenny (unan) to approve final budget for FY12/13.

Discussion: Emergency only access and egress alternatives to closure of Terrace Avenue and Overlook Road.
No update.

Discussion: Verizon request to add microwave dish to existing Crown Castle tower located on Fire District property.

Dir. Kimball reported that he met with Don Smith, Chief Brown and engineers from SiteSafe, and other representatives to discuss an EMF study to be done at the station. The meeting was informative and productive. Currently, there are six panel antennas operating on the tower and three more that are non-operational. The Omni antennas have been removed. The additional microwave dish requested by Verizon is not yet considered. A full EMF report to be completed by SiteSafe must first be done. Don Smith has asked SiteSafe engineers for a more thorough study to show gradations of EMF emissions at and around the station on a geographical map. Dir. Kimball commented that the SiteSafe engineers have been impressively open and cooperative with Don's requests. The meetings/discussions have been mutually informative and educational for everyone involved.

CONSENT CALENDAR

MSC, Kilkenny/O'Donnell (unan) to approve the Consent Calendar including the Minutes from the July 23, 2012 regular meeting and the warrant lists from July 18 – August 27, 2012, and the financial reports for June 2012 including the account balances.

PUBLIC EXPRESSION

Chief Brown reported that she tried twice to contact the post office to inquire about the locked back door at Jenny Pfeiffer's request. She has thus far not yet been able to contact anyone there. She will try again.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Dir. Kimball asked if an ambulance could be housed at the station and if drivers could use the sleeping quarters located in the station. Chief Brown answered that it is a question of funding for the County of Marin as staffing a year round ambulance is expensive. She said the seasonal ambulance, Medic 97, is housed out of Stinson Beach but, since several of the staff members are Bolinas volunteers and live out of the area, the ambulance has been seen at the fire house several nights as they have been sleeping here instead of commuting. R97

is funded for most of the summer months including July, August and September. Chief Brown announced that every residence in the California Fire SRA (State Response Area) will be charged a \$150 fee according to a recent State Bill passed in order to help balance the state budget. Residences in areas that are already protected by a local jurisdiction, will receive a \$35 reduction in the fee. Bolinas residents are within the SRA and are therefore subject to paying the fees. Detailed information regarding the fee is available at www.bolinasfire.org. Chief Brown wanted to emphasize that this is a fee imposed by the state not local jurisdictions and the state receives all of the funds.

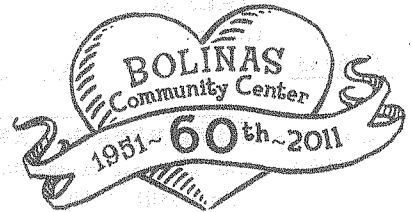
