Among the guests: Sid and Nancy Ganis, Alice Waters, Lt. Gov. Gavin Newsom and Jennifer Siebel Newsom, Jackson Browne, Dale Djerassi, Nion McEvoy and Leslie Berriman, Joshua Robison, Stefanie and Peter Coyote, Stanlee Gatti, Orville Schell and Liu Baifang, Ken Fulk, Ryan Phelan and Stewart Brand, Peggy Knickerbocker and Robert Fisher, an array of members of the indigenous clans Fisher and Walker, and many other folks with designer faucets who gamely crossed the pasture for facilities for one night in the country.


There was music every where (Sage, Dan Imhoff




