Year of the Water Dragon

The weather and the tide have been beautiful lately and I've been taking a lot of beach walks. Often I saw Schehera walking her two dogs, Charlie and Spiffy. At one point we were standing at the entrance to Brighton Beach, and talking about the ugly black graffiti spray painted on the walls. The crude graffiti gave the entrance a sinister ghetto look.

"The entrance is the mystic portal to the beach," Schehera said, "And it should be beautiful. Let's paint the Water Dragon on the wall and cover up that ugly graffiti."

"Sure." I answered, not sure if that meant tomorrow or some distant time in the future.

"Next week is good for me." she said, and that Tuesday we met at the entrance to Brighton Beach. Schehera already had a good idea for the design.

"Let's paint a curvaceous, double-headed Water Dragon and have the body spell out 2012."

That sounded good to me and I handed Schehera a stick of chalk to sketch her design on the wall. I trusted that the Water Dragon would be like her ceramics, bursting with ornate pattern and beautiful color.

After Schehera finished her sketch I filled in the body of the dragon. It felt good to be covering up the ugly graffiti with a beautiful water dragon. It was an exquisite January day on the beach, sunny and warm with no wind. The sun warmed my back as the Water Dragon took form, and the waves breaking on the beach made the sweetest rhythm.

We talked while we painted. We agreed that we needed to take better care of the entrance to Brighton Beach. It truly was a mystic portal to our beach and we should keep it beautiful and holy. All the graffiti had to go.

We talked about forming an art collective to continue and expand the efforts of replacing graffiti with beauty. For painting seawalls we both preferred using brushes and artist acrylic paint. Spray cans are toxic.

We discussed the raising of vibratory rates with art and beauty. Schehera said that beauty resonates at a higher frequency and develops a protective aura against the malicious graffiti monster. She pointed to a couple of examples at the beach. Their beauty, or some such quality, had kept them remarkably free of graffiti.

Next to the Water Dragon was the Poet's Nook. It's an area we try to keep graffiti-free for poetry. The Poets Nook is in memory of Owein Sanders. I remembered Owein and I wanted to contribute something about the Water Dragon.

"Year of the Water Dragon" I wrote in my best penmanship. Underneath I wrote the two words I'd heard about the Water Dragon: "Curvaceous, flowing . . ."

I was stuck and asked Schehera for help.

"Mystical unfolding," she said without a moment's hesitation.

I laughed. Sounds good to me. What a prediction:

"The Year of the Water Dragon:

Curvaceous, flowing, mystical unfolding.
Beautify, beautify, beautify."

(The Chinese New Year of the Water Dragon begins on January 23)

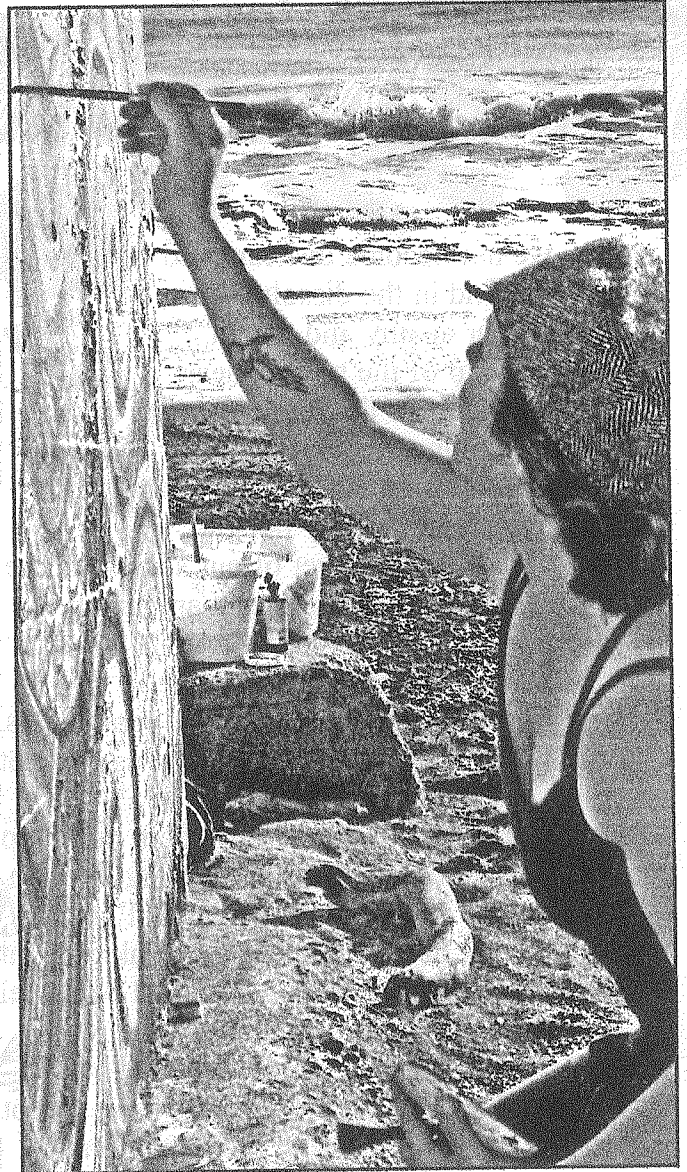

Myanmar Projects

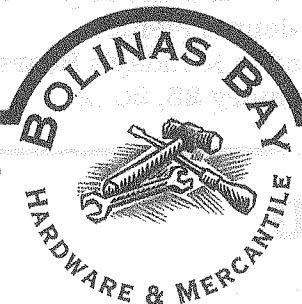
David Jaap van Leeuwen returned from Myanmar on January 1st after a two-month stay. He has been to Myanmar over 20 times and for the past 13 years in a row has gone there with project money to fund humanitarian projects.

On this trip during the two months of November and December, five deep-water wells were dug and five water-holding tanks were built in rural farming villages. Water is crucial during the dry season. These wells will help the people who live in these villages for many years to come. Approximately 2000 people live in each village.

David also started a program four years ago that educates and treats children who have scabies and ringworm. Scabies and ringworm are epidemic in Myanmar monasteries and nunneries where children live closely together. Over 350 children were treated and educated this year.

The other projects funded this year include an art program, an English language program for Myanmar children and David also taught children how to make rubber molds and concrete copies of Myanmar traditional designs.

Because he partners with two highly respected Myanmar Buddhist monks the projects funded each year have always been successful. He will be returning to Myanmar next November for another two-month stay and hopes to have wells dug and water holding tanks built in ten Myanmar farming villages. A DVD video report that documents the projects will be available in a few months, and will be free to anyone who is interested.

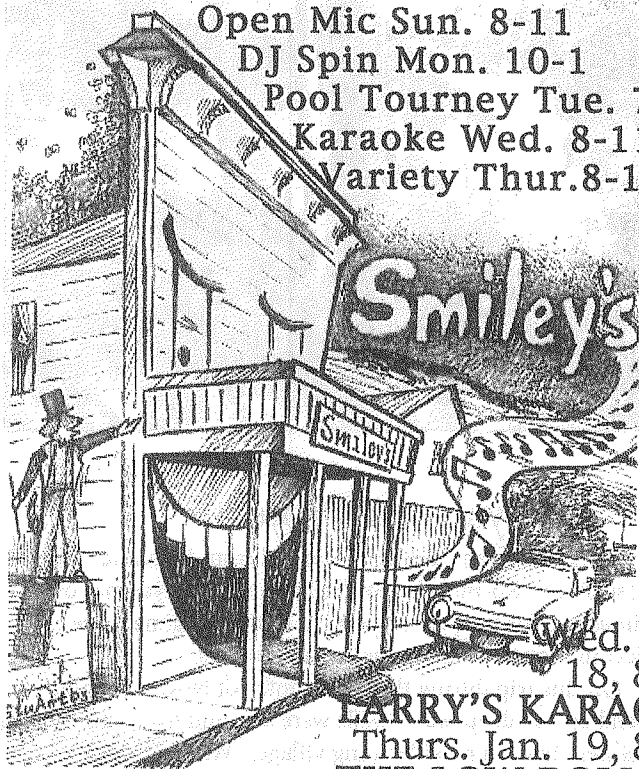

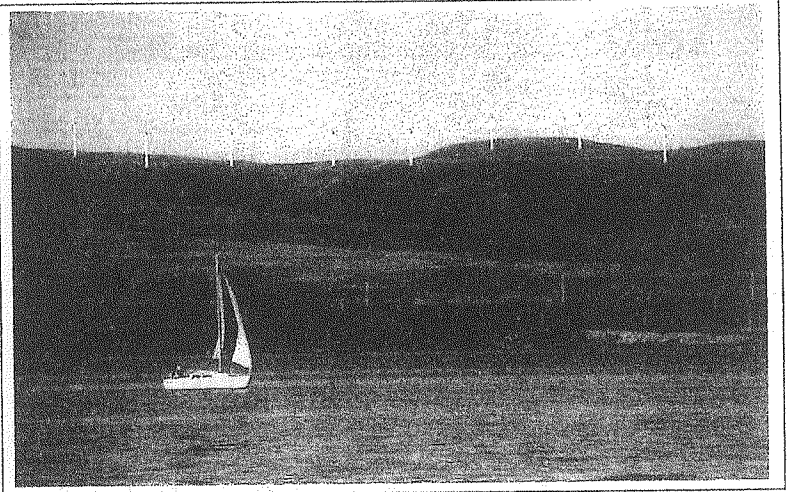

Hi Friends.

There's yet another Big Issue before us here in leading edge West Marin. (In addition to 'smart' meters that we need to act on before Feb. 1, and the proposed new Verizon drum-shaped antenna that's adding to their already increased antennas at the Bolinas Fire House cell towers...)

The issue is: **What are the appropriate scale and ownership guidelines for wind power in West Marin?**

Precedent-Setting Decision in the Making

Very soon the Marin Planning Commission will decide on a policy for WECS - Wind Energy Conversion Systems (i.e. wind turbines) - in West Marin's coastal zone. How large can WECS be and where they can be in the coastal zone is what's being discussed.

WECS range from 40 ft., 100 ft. to 400 ft and higher! **The Coastal Commission is watching what happens here closely and intends to use the policy determined here in Marin for the rest of coastal California**, according to Ruby Pap, North Central Coast District Supervisor for the Coastal Commission.

What are the pros and cons? What are the issues? Why would anyone object to wind power? Isn't it green and desperately needed? Why are some people who live near WECS getting sick and abandoning their homes? Why is there a gag clause in the contracts?

Do we need to use WECS or fry from climate change? Are people who bring up concerns shills for the nuclear and fossil fuel industries? Are there any other human and environmentally friendly local power generation potentials? Many of these questions are explored in an award winning film to be shown Friday night. **WINDFALL**, by Laura Israel looks at both sides of wind energy development when the residents of a rural upstate New York town consider going green.

The film showing, sponsored by EAC, Environmental Action Committee and West Marin/Sonoma Coastal Advocates, is at 6:30 pm (doors open at 6 pm.) at the Dance Palace in Point Reyes.

Speakers will give a Local Coastal Program Update and discuss Marin County's proposed plan to allow 100-foot tall industrial wind turbines east of Highway One in the Coastal Zone. See: windfallthemovie.com

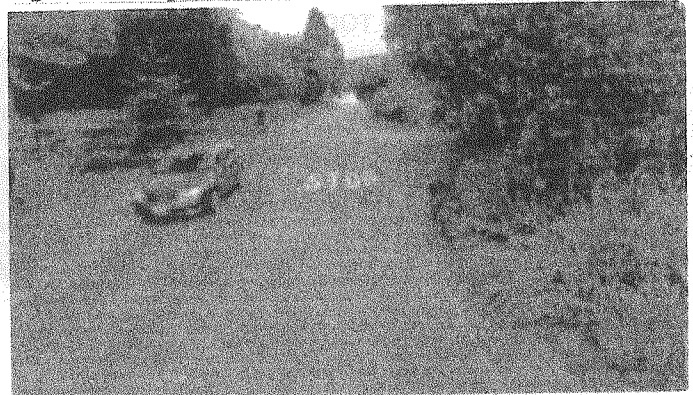

Thrilling Threlkeld

You may have seen or heard that the fine CBS reporter from the '70s and '80s, Richard Threlkeld, was killed in an automobile accident near the Hamptons on Long Island last Friday. I had an unusual and amusing driving relationship with him for most of two years starting in 1970.

First, some background. In July of 1968 I started working for the Statewide Administration, or the Office of the President, of the University of California which was housed in University Hall on Oxford Street between University and Addison. I commuted from our flat in San Francisco on Lyon Street. After two years of this, Barbara, who spent as much time with Alex as she could in our Bolinas house, and I decided all we were getting from the SF place was a shorter commute for me. So, in 1970 we moved into our house on Larch Road and I started driving over Panoramic, 101, the Richmond Bridge, Hoffman Blvd, Albany and Berkeley - I made that trip in an hour flat, door-to-parking structure.

One evening as I was charging up Edgewood Avenue in Mill Valley in my white Beetle I came across a grey Mercedes which had slowed to turn left into a dirt road which seemed to have only one house at its far end. Since then it has been paved, with stone gateposts at the beginning and several houses along the sides. It also has a street sign saying "Hart Lane" and a stop sign on Edgewood.

Apparently, the sight of my bug hurtling at him panicked the driver who jack-rabbed out of my way. I recognized the driver. It was Richard Threlkeld who had recently been stationed in San Francisco by CBS. We replayed this little drama a number of times over the next year and a half or more. He never got used to the sight of my VW and its apparently unrelenting charge.

Threlkeld was next assigned to LA and then to Viet Nam where he distinguished himself as a journalist, a TV reporter and as a writer.

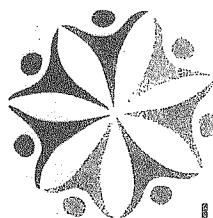

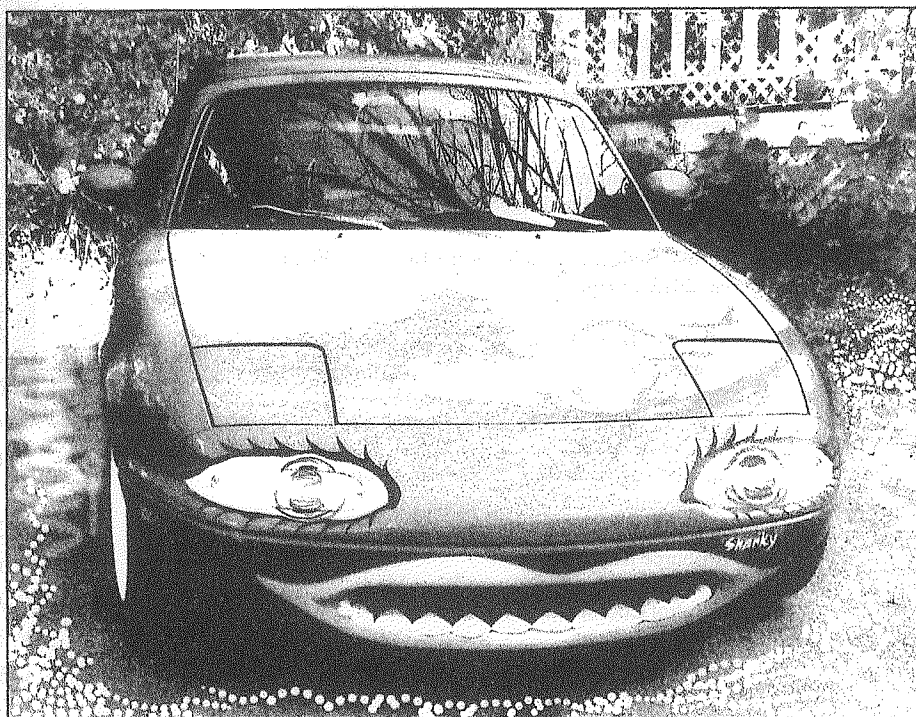
