WHY DOES MY WATER LOOK DIFFERE IS IT SAFE TO DRINK?

We have received several calls in recent days from community members reporting that their drinking water seems to be discolored and asking if it is safe to drink. The reason for the coloration of your drinking water is the fact that the BCPUD currently is drawing from its emergency water source, Woodrat Reservoir 1. The storms this winter have raised the turbidity levels in our preferred water source, the Arroyo Hondo Creek, and impaired our access to the creek, as well. Naturally-occurring minerals in the Woodrat Reservoir 1 water are the source of the color and do not pose a health risk. As soon as we are able to do so, the BCPUD will resume drawing water from the Arroyo Hondo

Last Sunday afternoon we saw our community rally beautifully in response to the unifying challenge of these times: Resisting Fear/Assisting Love. 15 or so hardy, happy women walked in the rain through town, along Wharf, and out onto the beach, returning to the fireside in the CC, where over the next 2 1/2 hours we grew in number to 100 or so, upholding the rights of women and humans everywhere, and in solidarity with the 2.2 million who marched all over the world. The grass roots mycelium of this community was growing its connective tissue.

As people "suddenly" being made to "wakeup", we can use this to unite in each present moment as never before. It really is now or never, and that is phenomenally energizing.

My reply to a letter from Leila Monroe on the Nextdoor site, addressing. ordinances about to be enacted against vehicle-dwellers in town. A meeting with our board of Supervisors has been called for Tuesday Jan 24 – now yesterday – in which parking ordinances have been drawn up which will effectively eliminate the house-dwellings on Brighton, and on the streets in town in general. This is happening in spite of efforts by the Bolinas parking committee, the BCLT and the BPUD to deal with our problems internally.

Leila, thank you for your thoughts, and for posting this! It's heartening that you and the others of the Bolinas Parking Committee, the BCLT, and the five elected members of the BCPUD have dedicated so much time to this issue. My strong impression after being in attendance of two of the meetings is that most - seemingly all - of those who sit on these boards are in accord with the desire to settle this matter in our own way, in our own town. Yes, I understand that there are those, perhaps more than I'm aware of, who are not happy with the situation on Brighton Ave, with the mobile-home dwellers. But I feel confident to say that everyone whom I personally know, at least a dozen in homes on Brighton who own and actually live in those homes - full time - are forthright with me in their warm and vocal support of my living situation on the street in my caravan. (For those who don't know, it's the red 'gypsy wagon' which I built in the 80's and has been rather a town landmark ever since. I've only lived in it for the past year, otherwise it has been parked in a driveway or side-yard of the several households that my wife and I have lived in, maintained, beautified and raised a family in over the course of the past 36 years.)

Since the complaints have become formal, with meetings to address the issues, I've met with or seen at the meetings some of those who are filing those complaints. Good people I'm sure, but in all my years in this town, being a consistent and active participant in many events and functions, I've only noticed for the first time, these folks who're making the complaints. I know that some of those houses sit empty for long stretches of time or are used exclusively for Air BnB. So the consequences of not enough houses to affordably rent have become visible. As Leila said, we must try to think holistically. I don't like to think in terms of them and us, but in this case those lines have been drawn, so I will speak directly to you who are disturbed by us.

For you, your problem is a matter of a personal distaste. I can understand that, I carry my own; there are things that I really don't like to see. But now your being annoyed has become a major problem for a number of us out there who seriously don't have options. Personally, I'm resourceful, I'll find a way, but I'm not speaking just for myself. Homelessness is a tragic situation and is only growing in this country. Vehicle-dwelling is the cheapest and most immediate of all solutions – the 'let it be' solution. It's easy


to do, maybe uncomfortable to look at, but easy — even fulfilling in the long run. Why not join in with the happy free spirit of this town, rather than calling down ordinances that will displace those who are making do with very little. Where will they go? It's a painful dilemma for them. Can't Bolinas remain the rare sanctuary in this increasingly unwelcoming world? Is anyone out here causing any real trouble? Everyone who has bought into this particular town has to have known of its character and origins. It being a laid-back community is why people who come here to visit smile a lot. I would love to see our little Bolinas-town thrive and grow, with all of our class-levels living in happy harmony. I welcome any conversation, I tend the bookstore. And you know where I live. Peace. Yup - and Love.


