

Galactic Butterfly Mayan Creator God

A Healthy Bolinas Tale

It all began way back in 1973 with dual synchronistic events. First I met the Zenos and moved into their Berkeley pad on College Avenue by Ashby while they took over a house on lower Terrace, Bolinas.... Then, I had a call from my Michigan doctor pal Marty Rossman asking me to join him and Dr. Irving Oyle at the Bolinas Headlands Healing Service ("We are doing some cool things out here; I think you'll be interested.") located at the Presbyterian Church on the entry corner of this magical town tucked away across the channel from the tip of Stinson Beach Seadrift. I remember feeling a sense of awe on my first drive along the lagoon into town thru the eucalyptus corridor.

Today—almost 40 years later—I am still visiting Bolinas, and enjoying the special Nature of this unique coastal town, and seeing my friends Karly and Zeno (who still live here) and the many people I have met during the beginning of my medical career. And let me share with you that it's been quite an exciting and blessed journey along these past few decades.

I was here again this year for Thanksgiving and then right before Christmas, returning for Solstice days, to enjoy the quiet sunny days and low tides with my family. The natural beauty of this area along the California coast is truly awesome, rejuvenating and restoring my body and soul whenever I return.

I began here in Bolinas as an 'alternative, holistic doc' where I say I did my self-designed residency in "metaphysical and natural medicine" right here in "Bobo", the coolest counter-culture California town. During this early period, I was intensely reading, studying and applying to practice the ancient systems of medicine, numerology, astrology and tarot; palmistry and iridology; nutrition and natural medicine; and herbal therapies.

Since those early days in Bolinas with Marty and Irving, my medical career has evolved and prospered. To-day, I practice at and direct our integrated, family medicine at Preventive Medical Center of Marin ("PMCM"), my 28 year-old clinic in San Rafael (HYPERLINK "http://www.pmcmarin.com" www.pmcmarin.com). With twenty staff and practitioners, we offer a wide range of medical services to patients in the greater San Francisco Bay Area and beyond

In our Bolinas Clinic (1973-75), Irving led Marty and me in the areas of guided imagery and healing mind therapies (and by the way, Marty still practices in Marin). I was also learning about herbs from the several local and visiting herbalists that came for the unique properties and plants of this coastal town. Marty had already studied Chinese medicine and acupuncture and he shared with me some of his knowledge of this ancient natural system, plus I began studying the very few books that were available for review at that time on the history and practice of Chinese medicine and acupuncture.

Together, we also studied the effects on sound vibrations on the acupuncture system and body, and we observed people go into deep relaxation where they could imagine their body healed and listen for the guidance of the inner wisdom. This became the practice of "guided imagery" and "mind-body" medicine that Dr. Rossman has popularized in his writing and teaching, and still practices today (see HYPERLINK "http://www.thehealingmind.org" www.thehealingmind.org).

My time in Bolinas was more than an intellectual learning experience—it was also a period of personal transformation. Basically, I had to retrain and re-educate my overweight, allergic and congested body to eat lightly and to fast, doing my first Stanley Burrough's 10-day Master Cleanser Lemonade Diet in May, 1975. What an amazing experience! I let go of 20 pounds, and my allergies and

congestion disappeared (and still to this day). This first experience in Bolinas has led to years of detoxifying diets, cleansing, further weight loss and overall improved health and vitality. And it has become a focus of much of my work, writing and publishing The Detox Diet book and using the name Detox Doc®.

During my years in Bolinas, I actively wrote about my initial cleansing experience in the Hearsay News and it was so amazing for me-that I decided as a newly practicing young physician—I would offer a free guided cleanse at the late Julie Holter's Ocean Parkway house overlooking the Bolinas Bay and San Francisco. About 20 people attended my first cleanse class in June, 1977, including Michael Lerner of Commonweal and Jim Anderson, the then Hearsay editor. It was a totally awesome experience that not only influenced hundreds of people over that Spring/Summer, but affected my entire medical career to become a doctor/teacher and help people prevent disease and improve health through healthy nutritional means. (And I wrote about this first guided cleanse in the "Spring" section of my first book; Staying Healthy with the Seasons, still in print today.)

I have continued to do an annual guided juice cleanse every Spring since that of 1977. In addition, I do and oversee other 3-week Detox programs at my clinic in San Rafael every January for New Year's and often an Autumn Detox in September to lighten up and prepare for the holiday season. To me, it is one of the most rewarding activities I do in my medical work as people experience such positive, healing changes, often life altering for years to come.

In effect, my writing career began in Bolinas with these initial articles on cleansing and seasonal nutrition, which eventually became a regular health column in the Hearsay News. Eventually I sent my mimeographed color-coordinated (per season, of course) to hundreds of friends and family around the country. Based upon their positive feedback, I decided to turn the articles into my first book.

None of this would have happened if I hadn't met the "Princess of Argisle" (Bethany), hanging out with the monarch butterflies in purple-gate valley. At the time Bethany had just finished a show that she wrote and directed created with the children at the Bolinas school, a show called "Come along under the Sea, with the Princess and me." I loved her energy and her magical creativity, and shortly after we met I aligned with Bethany to form a creative partnership that has flourished and remains to this day. Bethany helped me in many areas of my life and career, including my growing medical practice and as an editor and manager, in the extensive evolution and refinement of the Staying Healthy with the Seasons manuscript (typed several times pre-computers; can you imagine?) before it was edited by Penny Post, who then lived in Bolinas. "Seasons" was published in 1981 by Celestial Arts Publishers, located at the time in Millbrae on the SF Peninsula (Celestial relocated to Berkeley in the 1980s as it merged with Tenspeed Press, and recently became part of Random House in New York). Over the ensuing 30 years, I have continued working with TenSpeed as publisher with my Nutrition tome, Staying Healthy with Nutrition (1992, 2006), and then The Detox Diet (1996, 2004, and soon 2012 as Third Edition). Over the years, I have worked with other publishers (see HYPERLINK "http://www.elsonhaas.com" www.elsonhaas.com and HYPERLINK "http://www.haashealthonline.com" www.haashealthonline.com); yet, I still have a good working relationship with Tenspeed.

I am currently working on another book about my vision for the future of health care in our nation. This book will become the third work of my "Staying Healthy" trilogy, all of which began nearly four decades ago in the inspiring, healing community here by the beach.

I am also still ambitious to help our planet's healing by encouraging and teaching people to live and work consciously with our Earth's energy. This mission was given to me by local poet, Mim, (circa 1977) who gave me a special lapis ring with other minerals covering it so it that looks like the Earth from outer space. She told me, "Dr. Elson, you are one of the planet's helpers, ending with her favorite slogan, "If you're gonna do it; do it with love!"

Dr Elson and the Detox Doc also became "Dr Sun" here in Bolinas as I began writing a series of songs for children about their bodies and their health. These songs were originally developed with Argisle's minstrel, Gary Guitar, to go along with a line of anatomical t-shirts that Bethany and I began to create and sell in the late 1970s and early 80s. For example, one of our anatomical t-shirts showed a colorful diagram of the heart, for which we wrote the song "Thump-Thump". Each of the major body systems had a shirt and a song (we even had socks showing the bones and muscles of the feet with reflexology on the bottoms). During those early days of collaboration in Bolinas, Bethany, Gary and I created a live show that at the time we called "The Anatomy Strip" (wearing eight shirts all at once and stripping them off one at a time), and we began local performances to kids in Bolinas. Eventually we performed this show in schools around California.

Last year Bethany and I formed a new partnership called Seasons Studios and we worked with artist Stuart Chapman here in Bolinas to create the illustrated songbook and CD called The Anatomix Comix, a fun and lively educational journey through the body systems based on "the Anatomy Strip." Check out the new Anatomix Comix App on I-tunes to review for your kids and grandchildren. Bethany has also been devoted to saving the whales and protecting the ocean habitat and has her book and App available, called Blimps & Whales. We also met artist Neil Osborn on Bolinas Beach and have worked with him as illustrator for both Blimps and his story Count Broccula. 

our solar system. They also believed that the ultimate Creator directs everything that happens in our galaxy from its center through the emanation of periodic energy bursts of consciousness.

Expatriate Post: Dispatch to Boboland from a Small Town near Baja California – X

Meandering in a realm of reasonable certainty, I am confident that I was not Marie Antoinette in a previous incarnation. 'How can you be so sure?' you might be asking yourself. It is true I have been called imperious, naïve and immature at times with a particularly unwarranted aversion to any pressure on the back of my neck and a weird attraction to very nice muslin curtains. However, unlike the tragic monarch, I happen to eat my cake. That silly lass with the infamous hairdos kept her chefs busy cranking out sugary confections which never passed her lips. Wanting to maintain her girlish figure, she would simply hold the sweets up to her nose and give them a sensuous snuffle.

Now, in the unreasonable realm where I tend to reside most of the time, I have an unusual fascination with cake; its essence, its texture, its perfume, its glorious flavor. Little pale pink petits fours adorned with minute roses intrigue me as much as any precious gem; layer cakes seduce me like buttercream-infused Svengalis. The very odor of cake triggers serotonin in my brain. No need for Prozac. As a child, cake batter, like a balm, made my nostrils quiver with delight. I could smell the amalgamation of butter, sugar, eggs and vanilla from across the house, from the garden, from the beach! The actual biscuit-y layers baking in the oven sent out an even more powerful signal; the fragrance spiraling from the kitchen vents infused the fog and tapped the wind like Morris Code.

I do have a nose, an uncanny sniffer, that is not always a desirable feature. Pre-GPS, I could, indeed, signal the approach to a town from the middle of the Arizona desert by receiving the site specific scent code of frying hamburgers before anyone else. My family, tucked in the car like overheated sardines, was always amazed. This skill gave me prestige, a certain elevated status, for at least as long as it took to find the imminent burger stand. Nevertheless as a child, I was, more often than not, disconcerted by the odors of quotidian life: acrid armpits, moldering shoes, dog farts, school buses, gym lockers and boiled cabbage, to name a few.

If France has given me anything, it is the ability to trick my nose and thus my brain. For it is in France that there is more stinky stuff than anywhere else on the planet. In particular, there is a lot of stinky cheese. The irony is that the more fragrant the fermented lump of goat, cow or sheep's milk, the more luscious, creamy, nutty and sweet it is at its heart. Cheese is wrapped in leaves, massaged with olive oil, rolled in herbs and bathed in sweet alcohol. As it ages, it goes from Jekyll to Hyde on the odor scale.

Just recently, we had a dinner party and as I was putting the finishing touches on the table, I smelled something in the dining room. The alarm bells went off, my nose went wild and I wondered how a dog could have gotten into the house. We don't have

a dog. Maybe someone had brought something in on his shoe? Perhaps the cats had left me a gift? They were always leaving me startled, half-eaten geckos and rodent body parts. Suddenly, Margaret appeared with the wine basket and I asked her, "What is that smell?" "Oh," she replied, "Maybe I put the cheese platter out too soon?" "Ahh...," my brain skidded sideways, flopped over backwards and performed a pirouette. What had been, just seconds before, something dead or pre-digested was suddenly a gorgeous, oozing white cheese from the monks in Burgundy, a burbling ash-covered cone of goat cheese from the mountains and glistening blue cheese from the enchanted caves of Roquefort. The cultural conditioning that programs us to know "that which is smelly" comes to a screeching halt, whips into reverse and reintroduces reeking and putrid as elements of haute cuisine - cheese, "milk's leap to immortality!" - stunningly beautiful creamy stuff served with walnuts or a grape, a chunk of baguette and the last of the wine at the end of a meal.

I have to trick most of the Americans who come to stay with us, or should I say I have to recondition them. It would be disaster to serve cheese when the evening is young. Sober Americans in front of a steaming cheese with a leathery skin smelling of boiled socks is a sure recipe for failure. They must be fed garlicky olive spread and spicy southern wine with a peachy tinge and copious amounts of Moroccan anchovies bathed in olive oil. parsley and garlic and golden free-range chicken roasted with mountain thyme and rosemary and then some more wine. They must be regaled with stories, as well, of shameless Americans who come to France and eat at McDonald's and never touch the cheese from goats who feed on lavender. Then, and only then, will they venture to carve a wedge from the undulating, vaporous furry cheese that has absolutely no resemblance to their Monterey Jack or that orange rubbery stuff that comes in a box or a can and requires no refrigeration. I have not pushed my luck with the cheeses from Corsica; the definitive poo poo cheeses that even test the will of great warriors with their malodorous-ness and little milk worms.

I cannot lie. I once loved odorless Monterey Jack and Cheeze Whiz when I was young and even more naïve. The ultimate cheese experience was Kraft Macaroni and Cheese. On occasion, our family tested the limits with Limburger. When we were chic and daring, we drove up to the French cheese factory and ate (relatively mild) camembert. The cheese of all seasons was sharp-cheddar in a hermetically-sealed package. It garnished tacos and chili con carne of the highest standards. Oh, and Philadelphia cream cheese - so versatile at brunches and in cheese cake, so mild and inoffensive.

So, maybe I was a lot like Marie Antoinette sniffing at things and loving cream-filled cakes. Bottom line is, that poor, gangling, maladroit girl should never have had her head cut off. She had plenty of cake to go around. That's why she said what she said. Big mistake. I never would have said, "Let them eat cake," because there simply wouldn't have been any around.

Mayan highly accurate Long Count Calendar is based on this precept. The Mayans also believed that time originates out of the Hunab Ku and is controlled by it.

George Winston grew up mainly in Montana, and also spent his later formative years in Mississippi and Florida. During this time, his favorite music was instrumental rock and instrumental R&B, including Floyd Cramer, the Ventures, Booker T & the MGs, Jimmy Smith, and many more. Inspired by R&B, jazz, blues, and rock (especially The Doors), George began playing organ in 1967. In 1971 he switched to the acoustic piano after hearing recordings from the 1920s and the 1930s by the legendary stride pianists Thomas "Fats" Waller and the late Teddy Wilson. In addition to working on stride piano, he also at this time came up with his own style of melodic instrumental music on solo piano, called "folk piano. His latest solo piano release is "Love Will Come—The Music of Vince Guaraldi, Vol. 2" (released 2/2/10), which features compositions by the late jazz pianist, including pieces from the Peanuts® TV


