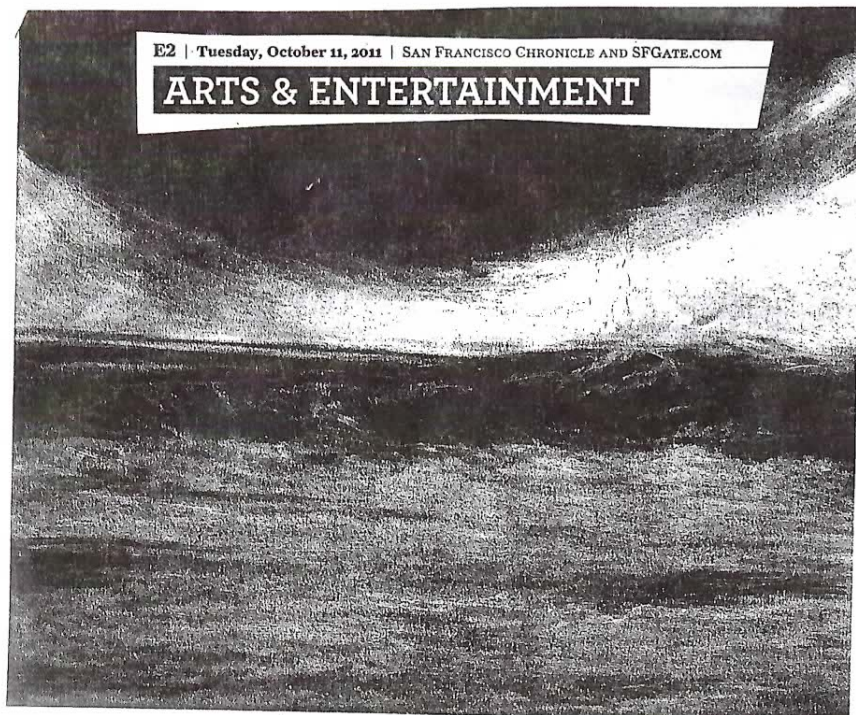

Together at the edge

Artistic father, mother and son combine talents for exhibition in Bolinas that captures ephemeral quality of Point Reyes

Jesse Reding Fleming can't remember a time when he wasn't surrounded by art. His mom, Chris

Reding, is a painter; his dad, Randall

Fleming, is a photographer and architect.

"There was always lots of studio soup at our house," his mom says. "Lots of paints, lots of cameras. Everybody was doing something, and Jesse pretty much had access to anything."

It was an unconventional childhood, and Jesse, 34, gravitated easily to the artist's life. He studied at the San Francisco Art Institute, became a still photographer and conceptual artist, and today works as a videographer.

Jesse was an only child, and the bond with his parents remains strong. The family sometimes collaborates on group projects: Their latest, an installation of images inspired by Point Reyes National Seashore, runs through Nov. 13 at the Bolinas Museum.

Made up of Randall's photographs, Chris' paintings and a 12-minute video by Jesse, the show has an unwieldy title: "38° 2' 26" N, 122° 47' 59" W: Coordinates of Place: An Artist Family Interprets the Land and Water of Point Reyes."

Initially, Jesse says, "we had the idea of maybe creating

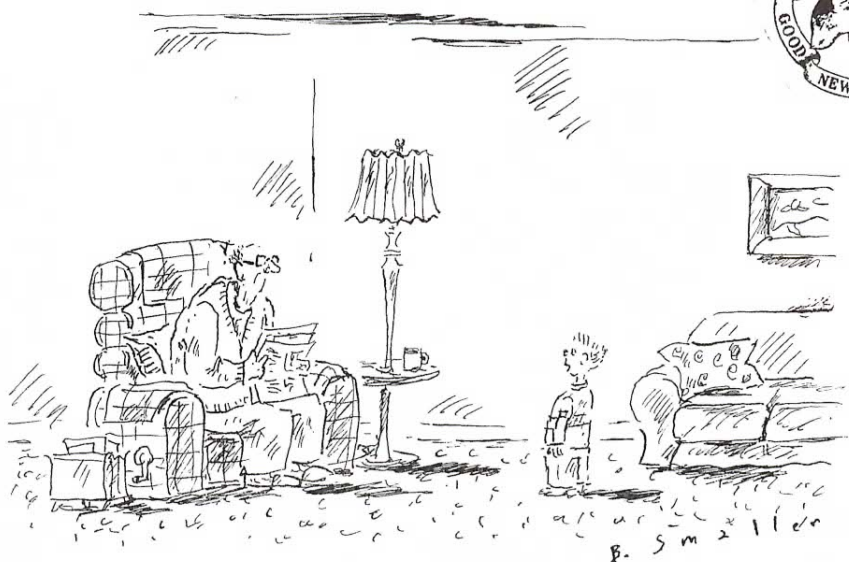
