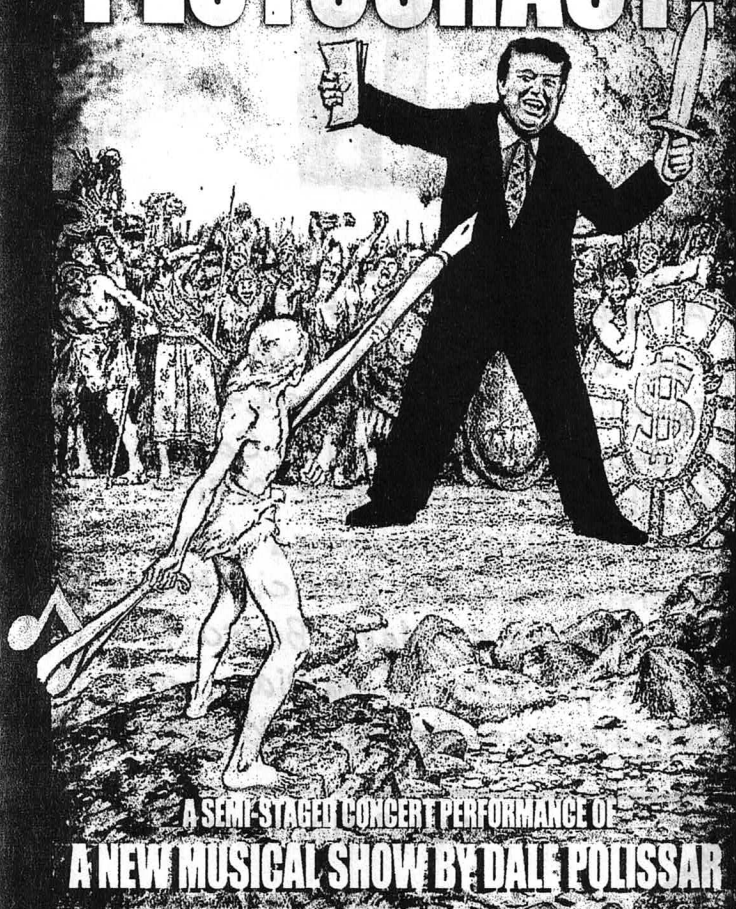

"PLUTOCRACY", THE MUSICAL PREMIERING FRIDAY NIGHT

I hope y'all will come down and enjoy my new musical show, "Plutocracy", which will premier in a staged dramatic reading Friday night, 8 pm, at the Community Center and Sunday, 7:30 pm, at the Point Reyes Dance Palace.

Later it will be playing in Berkeley at La Pena and in San Francisco at Noe Valley Ministry.

"Plutocracy" imagines what happens when the head of a global oil corporation dies and, to everyone's surprise, leaves control of the company to his young hippy poet son--with a powerful uncle determined to stop the lad.

The fine six-member cast features two Bolin's people: that classy songstress Beth Carusillo plays the hero's feisty girlfriend, and Bob Scott--he of the deep sonorous voice!--is the show's narrator. (Bob is also very funny as a conservative Southern senator.)

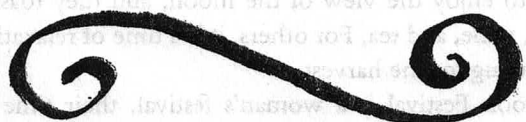
Also in the cast: Daniel Patrick, the Stinson impresario, whom many of you know from Common Voice Choir; Tim Mayer of San Francisco, who was a favorite in my previous musical show, "By George, It's War!" (satirizing the Bush administration); an amazing operatic tenor, Peter Webb of San Leandro; and the soulful contralto Madeline London of San Rafael.

FOOTNOTES ON "PLUTOCRACY"

Parents should know that "Plutocracy" is really not suitable for young kids. Along with sophisticated humor, there is a fair amount of profanity.

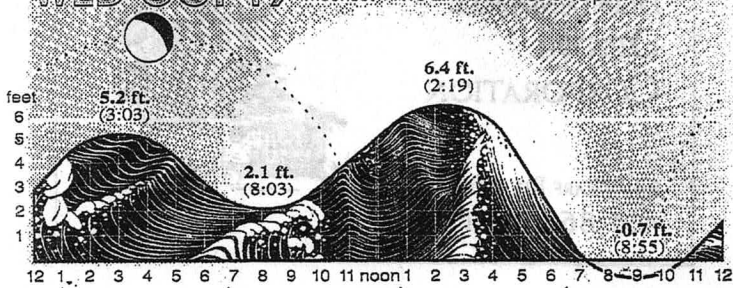

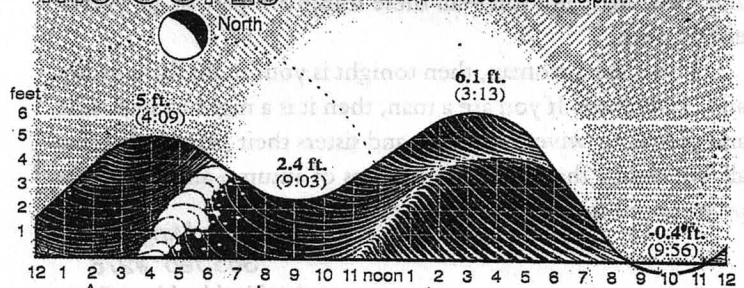

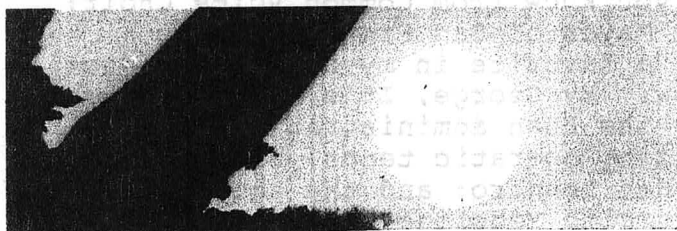

Tonight is the harvest moon. The queen of night is at her most perfect roundness, closer to us than at any other time of the year. She glows silver in an indigo sky.

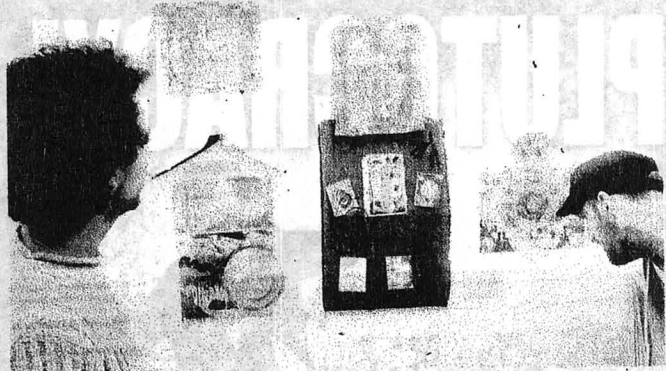

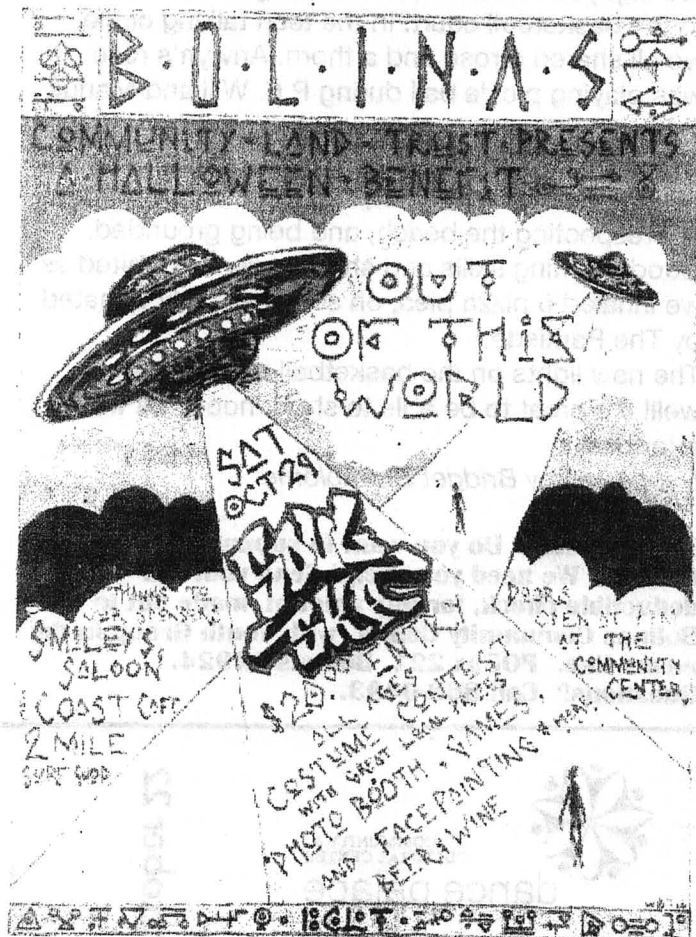

Hello Bolinas! I'm REALLY PROUD to announce that I have an art show happening, right now, at Gospel Flats Farm Stand. The body of work I am showing is my AMERICANA series of paintings.

I painted this collection nearly 20 years ago. When I was a young feminist working on my degree in Women's Studies at UC, Berkeley I came across a Woman's Day magazine from the 1950's at an estate sale in Kensington. I loved the technicolor imagery and the way it promoted the good life of home economics, processed food stuffs, cigarettes, cleaning products, and babies. It struck me as absurd and kind of sinister, as well as good source material for my art.

I have always loved absurdity and Dadaism and Norman Rockwell, these were also sources of inspiration. And I'm pretty sure my outrage at "American values" worked it's way into the work too. I couldn't help but notice that from the 1950's to the turn of this century, a lot ugly American propaganda, memes, and cliches were still operating: "boys will be boys", "the rule of thumb is..." (look up the origin of that one up on the internet, yikes.), "it a dog eat dog world", "kill the competition", "free market society", and "a woman's place is in....". Americana absurdity. Explicit. Colorful. Not true.

Mostly, I was just having fun with with paint, textures, colors, and old magazine images - playing with my freedom of expression.
