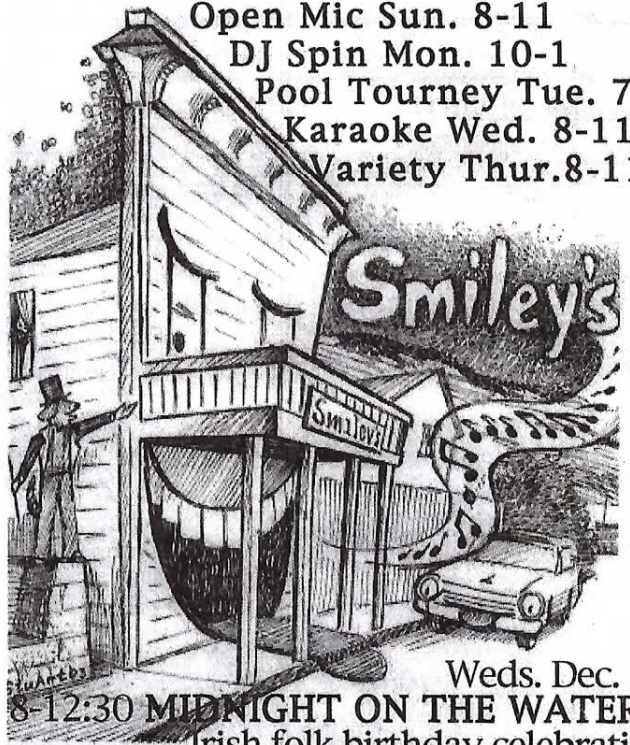

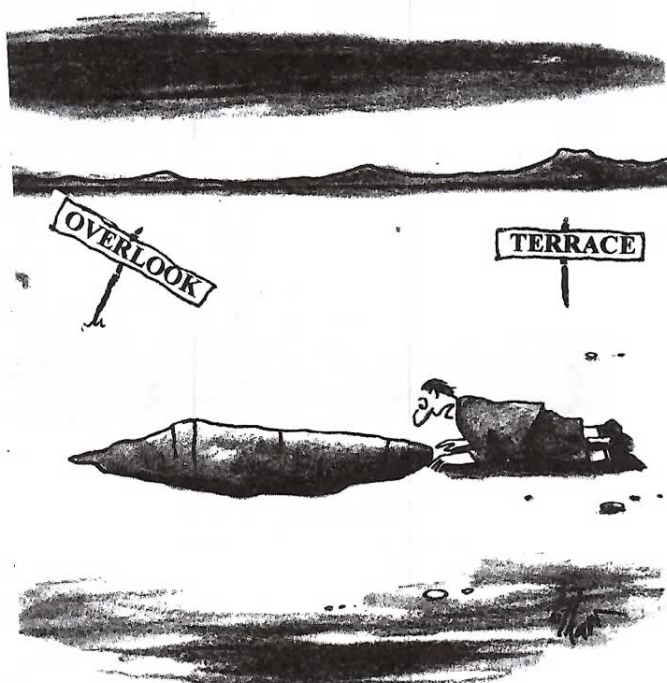

Bolinas

Bolinas is famous for trying to hide from curious visitors—thereby drawing hordes of them. They keep coming, even though town citizens regularly take down the turnoff sign on Highway 1. So if you're coming from the east (San Francisco area), turn left at the unmarked road where Bolinas Lagoon ends. If you're coming from the west, turn right where the lagoon begins. Don't worry—if you succeed in finding the place, people are friendly.

Sometimes it seems as if half the inhabitants of Bolinas are dogs, most of them black. They stand guard outside bars, curl at shop owners' feet, snooze in the middle of the road. You'll find no city hall in Bolinas, an unincorporated area, and no chamber of commerce. Dogs are always welcome here, but cars, horses, bicycles, and too many unleashed dogs compete for space. Be thoughtful and keep your pooch leashed in town.

PARKS, BEACHES, AND RECREATION AREAS

Alas, dogs are no longer officially allowed on beautiful Agate Beach.

Bolinas Beach

At the end of the main street, Wharf Road, is a sand-and-pebble beach at the foot of a bluff. Dogs are free to run off leash. But watch for horses—with riders and without—thundering past without warning. It's animal anarchy here, and it's not the cleanest beach in Marin. We give it points for fun, though. 415/499-6387.

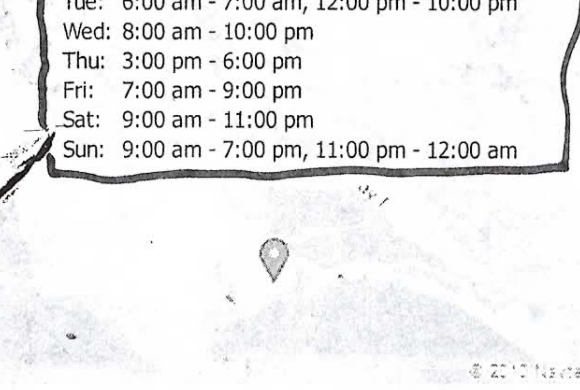

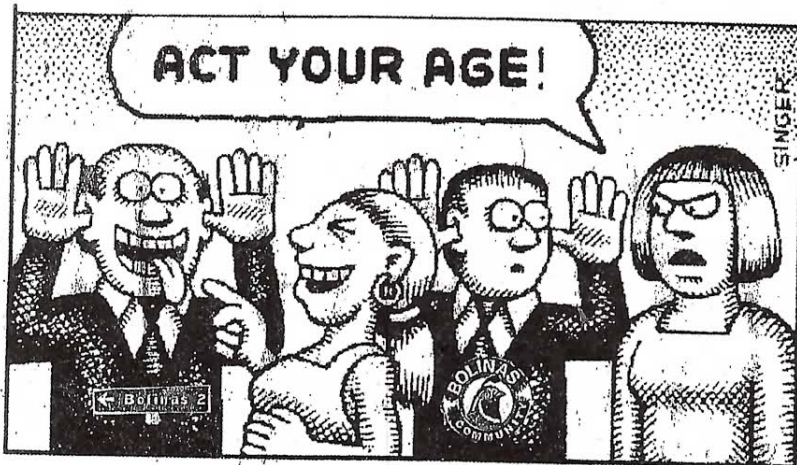

- What he did: Thorpe had 23 points, four rebounds and three assists, scoring almost half of his team's points in a 50-44 win over Encinal on Tuesday. However, Thorpe wasn't done proving that he is an offensive threat. On Thursday, he registered 24 points, seven rebounds and three assists to help Tam to a one-point lead with 20 seconds remaining in the game, but Albany was able to hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to win 58-56.

- What he said: "As a senior I feel like I have to lead. I like to attack the rim, doing what I have to do to score, pulling out all of my tricks. I think we can surprise a lot of people in MCAL."

- What's next: Thorpe's complete focus is on this year's basketball season. His goal is to lead his team to the playoffs. Thorpe, who plays both basketball and football, will enjoy having the spring season off; however, that doesn't mean he won't be playing basketball. The Bolinas resident can be found in his hometown playing pickup games with his friends.

- Off the court: Thorpe is like any other high school kid. He enjoys hanging out with his friends and going to see movies. He also enjoys spending time with his grandparents. Their favorite hobby is playing board games.

His favorite game is called pitchnut. It's a game with Canadian origins and is very similar to a miniature eight ball pool game.

• Trivial matter: This

all-around athlete likes to stick to what he knows: sports. His first word as a baby was "ball" and ever since then that is what he focuses on.

- Coach Michael Coffino: "He will do whatever is necessary to get the job done. In both games he stepped up and took over. He has a complete arsenal of offensive skills, which makes him particularly hard to defend. He is a great competitor. He hates to lose. I am really pleased with what he has done both in practice and in games."

Apocalypse... Whenever?

AS TOLD TO STEVE HEILIG

Greetings to the 7-billionth human, and welcome to Earth!

Please allow me to introduce myself. My name is Apocalypse. You may have heard rumors that I am coming for a visit soon and could cause quite a ruckus. Well, anything is possible. But perhaps there are a few things you might like to consider first.

This is not the first rumor of my impending appearance, not by a long shot. In fact, you humans have been predicting my arrival for millennia. People you now call prehistoric—ancient Greeks; Romans; Native Americans, both North and South; and so forth—have all had longstanding legends of my coming. Hindus, Muslims, Buddhists, all have had some version of me to fear or to embrace. Each landmark in time—say a millennium year, a total eclipse, or a comet coming relatively close to Earth—brings more predictions of my impending arrival. Some take things into their own hands—Genghis Khan killed over 10 percent of the human population in his time, and your World Wars fell short of that but were plenty horrendous. Other humans—Native Americans, to choose just one example—have already had their apocalyptic experience, with no need for my help. You can't blame me for those.

For some Christians, of course, the Book of Revelations has long provided a fairly detailed and harrowing tale of what I am supposed to bring. And it ain't a pretty picture! To deal with the fear and loathing, some folks hope a rapture of some kind will precede me and save them from the rough stuff. Even some would-be Presidential candidates say I could be coming anytime now. For a local example, see the repeated scares fostered by that Camping guy in Oakland—C'mon, sir, I'm patient and forgiving, but one more time and careful what you ask for! Better listen to your main man, Jesus, for once: "But of that day and hour no one knows."

On that note, let us turn to a more modern sort of Bible, the Book of Wikipedians. Some notable predictions of rapture dates include the following:

1844 – William Miller predicted that Christ would return between March 21, 1843, and March 21, 1844, but then revised his prediction to October 22, 1844.

1914, 1915, 1925, and 1942 – Jehovah's Witnesses predicted these various dates for the rapture.

1970 – Hal Lindsay's best seller *The Late Great Days of Planet Earth* predicted a rapture in the 1970s, which was followed by *Countdown to Armageddon* for the 1980s.

2011 – Harold Camping revised his prediction for May 21, 2011; afterward, he claimed that a "spiritual judgment" had taken place and that the physical rapture would occur on October 21, 2011.

2060 – In 1704, Sir Isaac Newton held that an apocalypse would happen no earlier than 2060.

2060 – In "Thank God It's Doomsday," an episode of *The Simpsons*, Homer Simpson predicts the rapture will occur within the week.

Ahem! I seem to have been a great disappointment. Y2K? Pffft. Nostradamus? Sorry, sir. Even Bob Dylan got it wrong during his devout phase. Those of a New Agey bent called on me to attend a "harmonic convergence" back in the 1980s, and now aficionados of a Mayan calendar and other traditions are naming the new year of 2012 as the time for ... well, something. The more technologically inclined have posted a "singularity," which appropriately rhymes with hilarity.

There's no consensus on what is coming, and I ain't telling ... not yet. Gotta keep folks guessing. Patience is a virtue. I will say this much: there's no need to come up with elaborate or simple theories about when I might arrive. When I do, it might indeed be subtle—"not with a bang but a whimper," as one of your great poets put it—or it might not be subtle.

Look around. Signs are everywhere. Your climate is changing—and don't let anybody tell you that you are not part of the problem. The atomic weapons you built are still waiting—on hair-triggers. There are already too many of you for the amount of food and water available, and more of you are on the way. The ocean fisheries are collapsing. Uncounted other species are already having their own apocalypse, while the microorganisms that were here before you still threaten your entire species. Your own waste and pollution may well be your undoing. Economies are melting down. You now own over one billion cars, and millions of people seem to really care about something called a Kardashian.

What to do? Again, look around. Those of you fighting to save everyone from my dreaded arrival in any of the above guises are your best—maybe only—hope. But then go look in a mirror: you might indeed not only be part of the problem but also the one you've been waiting for. Think about it—but not for too long. For I am you, and you are I, and one never knows when we might show up. 🐦
