

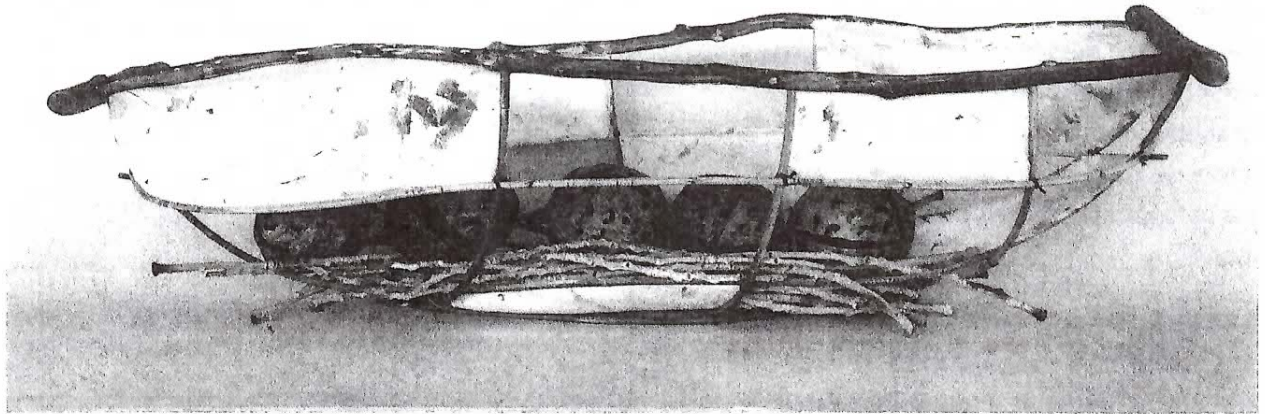

Cory's Column

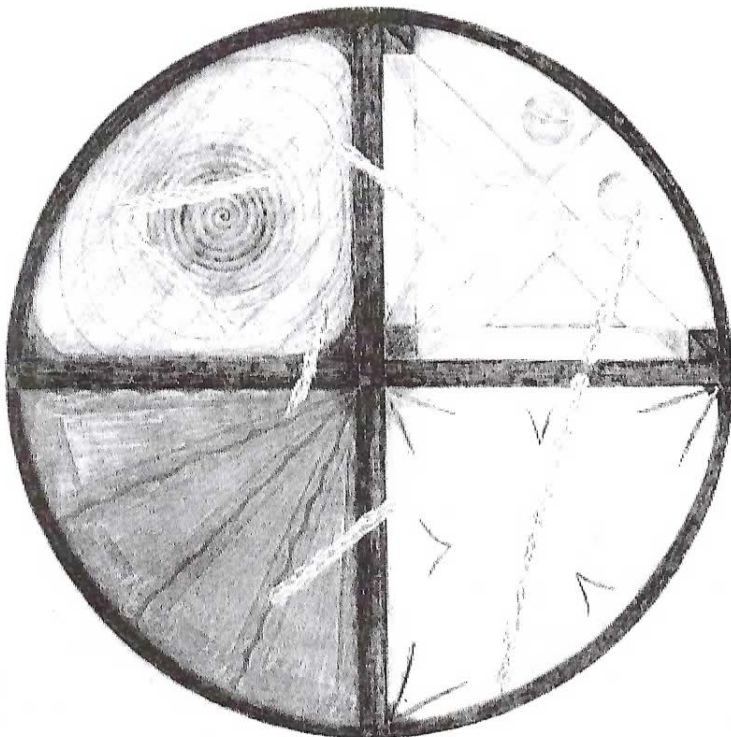

Earth's Bounty

Here is a recipe Eat Dog & I made the other night with our new crop of honey:

Rhubarb & Strawberry Tart

1 package of filo dough
olive or grapeseed oil for brushing the filo
(can also use melted butter)
5-6 stalks of Rhubarb, cut into 1" pieces*
3 cups of fresh strawberries, sliced*
1/2 to 3/4 cup of honey
1/4 teaspoon rose water**
2 tablespoons corn starch
1/2 cup water

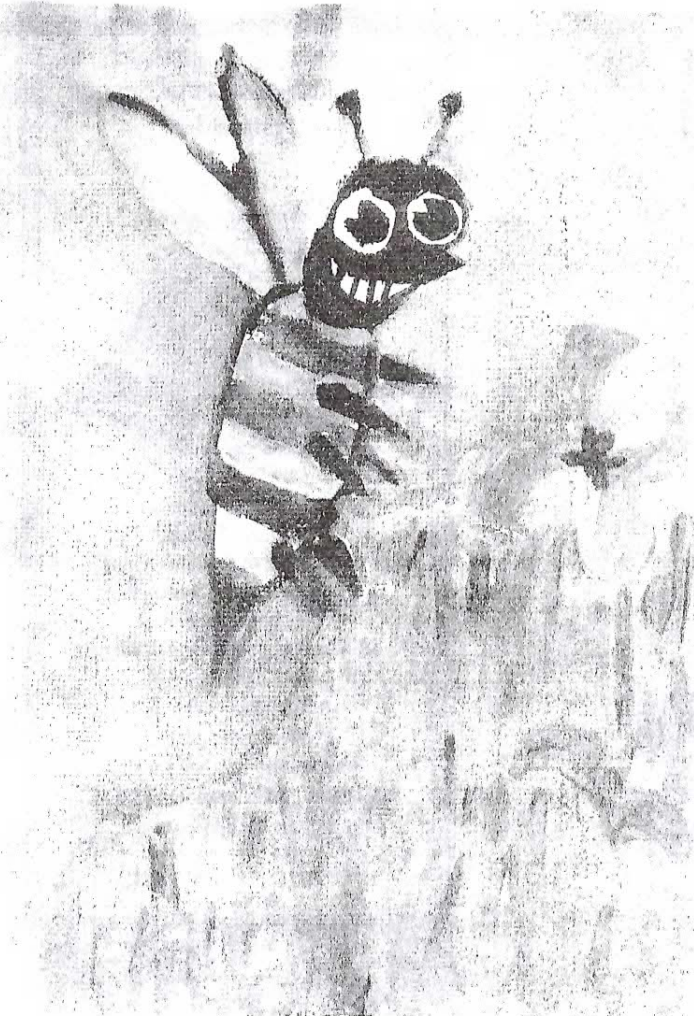
Pre-heat the oven to 350°. Line glass casserole dish (8" x 12") with 5-6 layers of filo dough, brushing each layer lightly with oil before adding the next layer. Carefully fold the dough up the sides of the dish & trim the top. Bake for 5 minutes until barely browned. In a sauce pan, simmer the rhubarb with 1/4 cup of water and the honey for 5-10 minutes. Add the sliced strawberries and simmer for another couple of minutes. Mix the cornstarch with the remaining 1/4 cup of water until it is dissolved and pour it into the fruit mixture stirring until the mixture thickens. Take the pan off the fire and add the rose water. Be careful not to add too much – a little goes a long way. Spread the fruit mixture evenly over the filo in the dish and add another 5 to 6 layers of filo over the top. Bake 15-20 minutes, until the tart is golden brown. Let cool before slicing.

*Blackberries can be substituted for the Rhubarb & Strawberry mixture.

**A few drops of rosewater added to any fruit in the rose family enhances the flavor of the fruit sublimely. Too much will ruin the dish.

Miles Tune

HONEY

Una asked Eat Dog & me if we'd like to write something about beekeeping and harvesting honey. She came over to our house the other day when we were getting ready to extract and bottle the honey we had just harvested from our hives at the nursery.

Once we've taken the boxes off the hive, it is a race to get the honey extracted and bottled before ants discover it. Our kitchen and dining area are transformed into a honey house. First the kitchen has to be thoroughly cleaned and the honey equipment cleaned and set up. Eat Dog carefully cuts the wax capping off the frames of honey and I load them into the honey extractor that spins the honey out of the comb. From the extractor, the honey is strained through a sieve to filter out chunks of wax and is collected in a stainless steel vessel with a spout.

From here it is decanted into jars.

It is a real test of patience to bottle honey. If the house is warm, the honey flows, but when it is cold, the honey slows to a trickle and I am always tempted to take my attention elsewhere and inevitably overflow the jar. I have yet to get through one bottling session without overflowing a jar.

After we have bottled the honey, all the equipment and the work areas have to be cleaned and the wax melted down for making candles.

MESA PARK AGENDA
MONDAY, JULY 11th, 2011
AT THE FIREHOUSE @ 7pm

Board members present: Geoff Geupel, Jane Mickelson, Charles Whitefield, Bryan Lee
Others: Suki Ferrari, William Richards, Lia Kourula (new manager of Bolinas Community Center), Vic Amoroso, Alethea Patton
Call to Order: 7:10 pm

COMMUNITY EXPRESSION :

William's report: picnic tables have increased usage of the downtown park area, as has warm weather. Needs additional \$30 per month for added cleanup for July. Has placed the protective plastic cover over the bulleting board at the DT park & needs some additional fasteners.[voted & passed, treasurer will be informed.] [Geoff] Add it to your invoice. Alethea has a park plan to put on the board.

Lia: Introduced herself as new manager of the BCC, and wants to get informed about the parks.

Charles: Has contacted the company that will be doing the roadwork around the lagoon. They'll give Bolinas the grindings for road repair & parking lot refinishing. He's going to meet with them and give them the parameters about where to place it & make sure it is placed correctly.

DOWNTOWN PARK-status

Alethea: Roger Peacock is project manager, and we had discussed the phasing of the project. 1st phase is based on available funds in DT Park fund: it encompasses tree work at the top of hill, mobilization of field office, lay-out & control, portable toilet, site prep for rest rooms, fence between Sam's house, etc. Cost approx. \$142,000. Jack S. is going to look into grants for the restroom installation & construction. Roger has submitted a contract & is working with contractors for bids. PG&E is going to look at easements for the electrical pole to see if we can trench to the restrooms or if we need to install an extra pole. The anonymous donor has put together fund-raising package and has agreed to contact potential donors & raise funds. Some may donate stock transfers, so it's important for the board to open a special account for transfers very soon. There may be tax implications. [Charles] Well Fargo has a brokerage arm so they would know how to set it up.

Discussion of Phases for Down Town Park

[Alethea] We should try to fund-raise for the entire amount at once. The donor suggested that the park be complete by 4th of July 2012. The goal is \$1.3 million. Currently there's \$175,000. [Charles] Concerning the deposit for the restrooms: is that part of phase 1? [Alethea] We have enough for the utilities now but not the restrooms, so I've put them in Phase 2. It may be prudent to wait until some of the funds are raised before we order the restrooms. The county is requiring that the trees on the hillside come down and that new trees be planted that can be maintained at no higher than 30 feet. There was a public hearing; residents were invited to come. One resident sent a letter in favor of taking the trees down, but no one else came. [Charles] The tree removal & replacement are a county requirement. Perhaps we could write a letter to each resident and explain clearly what's happening. I could take them around personally. [Alethea] That will happen this summer. I was also told that there's a group that wants to set up a farmer's market in the park, but once the construction begins the site is off-limits. Can they hold a market until then? [Charles] Doesn't it make more sense to hold it in a place where it can remain for the summer? We're going to need to fence the area off really well for safety in a way that's more than a signage. It will be up for about a year. [Bryan] Last meeting we were concerned about the deposit for the restrooms. We waited on that because it didn't seem imminent. I'd suggest we wait on it. [Alethea] Roger says even if the lead time extends, we can still put it in without too much trouble. The site preparation will be taken care of in Phase 1. There are 4 phases, the most expensive being the stonework. Last phase is landscaping, irrigation, and turf. There can be readjustments based on funds raised. All of the front stonework could be eliminated if we can't afford it, without damaging the appearance. The sidewalk's at the very end. Our bookkeeper sent you an invoice that needs paying. [Bryan] Roger will solicit bids as project manager? [Alethea] Yes. He needs to meet with Patricia to find out how the money's going to be disbursed. It's not a good idea to wait for board meetings each time he needs to pay an invoice.

[Charles] We're going to have to meet more than once a month to get it rolling. [Alethea] Maybe Roger should have the Phase 1 packet ready for the next board meeting so it can be approved and the money paid out as needed. [Bryan] It's good for him to solicit bids so we have that settled by the next meeting. We could have a special meeting if necessary. [Geoff] We were asked by the downtown committee to approve & sign the contract for \$25K for his work. [ch] these are not public funds. This person would be acting as our actuary, controlling and managing. We should be able to hire whom we feel appropriate. [Charles] I move that we conditionally accept Roger Peacock as manager if we are legally allowed to do so, and that he notifies the board on a monthly basis as per financial status. [Bryan] I will second this if we can be informed when he hits \$10,000 billing mark. [passed unanimously] [Alethea] I would expect he would come to the board meetings. [Geoff] For the agenda for next meeting let's be sure to invite Roger to discuss the Phase 1 plans.

MAINTAINANCE REPORT

[Suki] I called Shamrock & they're ready to deliver the bark ground cover for the playground. It costs \$172.50 for delivery and it's \$42.79 per yard. How much do we need? [Charles] Twelve yards, and we can store inside if necessary. It's an important safety precaution to maintain the play area. [Bryan] I make a motion to approve \$11-1200 for the job & materials. [passed unanimously]

POOL DEVELOPMENT-status

[Jane] We didn't get the Stinson-Bolinas fund grant this time around, but they suggested submitting another grant proposal later in the process. We've reserved the Bolinas Community Center for an information evening on September 11. There will be a free spaghetti dinner, to encourage families with young kids to attend; childcare will be available so parents can focus on the information without distraction. [Suki] I'll help with spaghetti dinner.

RECLAMATION/IRRIGATION PROJECT-status

[Bryan] We got a letter from State Water Resources Board saying there may be a water rights issue here; they want to see all the CEQA papers & will act as agent if there are water rights involved. I'm meeting with Jennifer this week. We had to go out for another public comment period and put it out for one month. If there's no comment then we can go to the county and get the application for the coastal permit. We're going to need to ask for the extension.

TREASURERS REPORT-status

[Geoff] I sent you all the notes of the latest balance sheets from Christine, the bookkeeper. She wants to set up the annual budget in QuickBooks. Patricia's been working with the county concerning the tax monies. Warrants: [Suki] Trimline from Jackson's \$102.30, 2 padlocks \$54.14. Checks 1124-1129 [see page 1 from Christine]: total \$579.96. [Charles] I move to approve warrants. [Jane] I second. [passed unanimously]

OTHER: Conversation between Dirk & Geoff: about the field maintenance request not being approved. [Charles] I agree it's difficult to charge the league for maintaining these fields right now, but once we have irrigation this will make the field more desirable & the leagues will want to use it. At that point they can contribute.

Approve Minutes of Last Meeting -- change incorrectly-stated "10 hours per month" for Suki's work hours to the correct 10 hours per week. Otherwise passed.

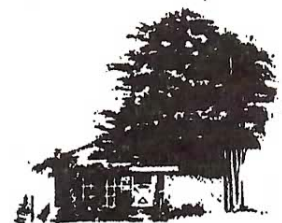
